SUBJECT: Project Status Update

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Commission receive and file an update on the status of projects related to the City's mobility and transportation infrastructure.

Information

Public Works projects are generally divided into two areas: (1) Capital Improvement Program (CIP) projects and (2) routine or special Operations & Maintenance (O&M) projects. Ongoing or planned projects related to mobility and transportation infrastructure in both of these areas, along with their recent status, are listed in the tables below.

Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Projects	Project Status
	No Significant Update Project complete and operational, closeout is underway.
Fair Oaks Traffic Signal Improvements Project	This project installs fiber optic cable and devices along Fair Oaks, Huntington Drive, and Fremont Avenue, as well as a Traffic Management Center (TMC) at City Hall and Public Works offices at the Garfield Water Distribution Facility (WDF).
	Project is complete and operational. Staff are awaiting as-built drawings from the contractor. A Notice of Completion will be brought to Council, and staff will request reimbursement from Caltrans. Project to be removed from the list.
	No Significant Update Staff completed invoicing agreement and working to release bid.
Mission and Fremont Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons	This project installs Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFBs) at Fremont Avenue and Lyndon Street, Mission Street and Diamond Avenue, and Mission Street and Fairview Avenue.
	Staff completed the process of setting up a Program Supplemental Agreement with Caltrans to initiate invoicing for Preliminary Engineering and Construction. Staff are preparing to release the bid package.

Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Projects	Project Status
Street Improvements	Updated Status First Design/Bid Package to be released by June. On March 1st, Council approved an On-Call Professional Service Task Order to facilitate the project delivery of multiple street improvement projects and develop a 5-year comprehensive and focused Street Improvement Program. Staff and the consultant are working with the design consultant to finalize designs that will be included in the 2022-2023 solicitation package – which will consist of 2-3 projects. The work will be discussed at the 'State of Streets' joint Council & MTIC Meeting on April 26, 2023.
Measure M Project Funding Requests	No Significant Update Two Projects Approved. Two of the submitted projects were approved (MM5506.06 - Grevelia Street and Fair Oaks Avenue & MM5506.08-Orange Grove Avenue Widening from Oliver Street to Arroyo Seco Park), and staff are working with Metro to file the documents necessary in order to execute funding agreements. Staff will evaluate the actions needed on the other submitted projects.
Columbia Street Striping & Signal Improvements	Updated Status \$9.9M in Measure R Mobility Improvement Project (MIP) Funds were approved by Metro, however the project will need to be revisited. On April 12, 2023 the City of Pasadena's Planning Commission determined Pasadena's funded project to not be consistent with the City General Plan. City staff will work with Pasadena DOT to determine the next steps to move this project forward.
Fremont/Huntington Mobility Active Transportation Project	No Significant Update Feasibility and charrette contract being developed. Staff worked with a consultant to develop a scope that includes feasibility work and public feedback sessions through a charrette process. Development of a proposed contract is underway.
City of Pasadena 'Stub' Relinquishment & Transitional Project Development	No Significant Update Awaiting Metro Board review. Pasadena submitted this long-term project to Metro for Measure R Mobility Improvement Project (MIP), and funding approval is pending review as it was separated from the larger MIP funding request that was approved in February 2023.

	No Significant Update Bid Package in development.	
Sidewalks Replacement & ADA Ramps Upgrades	Staff are developing the bid package for multiple curb ramp replacements along Meridian Avenue. The bid package requires review by a labor compliance specialist and several non-standard ramp locations require input from a design consultant. Once these reviews are complete, the package will be released for bidding.	
North-South Corridor Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) Deployment Project	Updated Status Public Outreach Meeting Scheduled. A public outreach meeting for this project will be held on May 18, 2023 at the Library Community Room. Staff and the consultant will hold the next project status meeting with the Federal Highway Administration and Caltrans in late April, to discuss progress on the Environmental Study.

This future proposed project is listed in the 5-Year Capital Improvement Program (CIP) approved by City Council on June 1 2022. The project is scheduled for implementation in Fiscal Year 2023-2024. Fair Oaks SR-110 Interchange Loop/Hook On-Ramp	No Significant Update Alternative study scope being developed for City Council approval. A task order to prepare initial study documents is being developed with a professional services on-call consultant for City Council approval. After Council approval, the consultant and City staff will coordinate a meeting with Metro and Caltrans to discuss near-term study work and future Measure R Mobility Improvement Project (MIP) funding. Staff will be presented an overview of these next steps during the March 21, 2023 MTIC meeting.	
Fair Oaks SR-110 Interchange Loop/Hook Grevelia Off-Ramp	No Significant Update Alternative study scope being developed. See above "Fair Oaks SR-110 Interchange Loop/Hook On-Ramp" status.

Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) Cycle 11 Projects	New Project Recently awarded grant funding. On March 9, 2023, South Pasadena was awarded over \$500,000 in HSIP funding for four (4) projects submitted in Fall 2022 related to street lighting, bike lanes, and pedestrian crossing improvements at multiple locations.

2022-2023 Slow Streets & Open Streets Program	Updated Status Residential designs to be presented. Work on the Mission Street deign is commencing with a review of the 2021 traffic study. A review of the residential street section is planned for the May 16, 2023 MTIC Meeting.

Staff are developing the requirements to implement a NTMP processing system, including an online/app form, community user guide, and a report output for staff. Recently, the pedestrian crossing at Meridian and Bank has been refreshed with new paint and a new sign. The nearby City trees have been trimmed and residents have been notified by mail to trim nearby privately owned overgrown trees.

Staff previously met with MTIC's Chair to review recommendations regarding the timing of signal lights and railway crossing gates at Mission and Meridian. Metro has provided a contact for timing issues to work with the City. A task order to update the timing sheets for this location is being issued to a professional services on-call consultant. The task order work will also reconcile the City's previously requested preemption changes with the known timing issues.	
Timing Improvements at Orange Grove & Monterey Signal	Updated Status Work underway. Traffic counts were collected in January. Staff are working to provide documents needed to make making adjustments to the signal timing and prepare updated signal timing sheets.

Replacement of Missing Orange Grove Street Lamps	No Significant Update Pending staff cost estimate. Staff are developing a cost estimate to replace the Orange Grove Street Lamps, and relocating the lamps away from the street where possible.

SUBJECT: Evaluation of a Second Crossing Guard for Huntington Drive

Recommendation

Staff proposes that the Mobility and Transportation Infrastructure Commission (MTIC) consider the draft report provided by the City's consultant Minagar & Associates, Inc. (M&A) and provide input and recommendations to staff related to the draft findings, and further recommendation to Council on next actions.

Background

On July 27, 2022, the City Council held a Special Meeting to review residents' request for a second crossing guard at the intersection of Huntington Drive and Marengo Avenue for the 2022-2023 Marengo Elementary School year. The City Council received numerous comments and feedback from the public in support of the second crossing guard, so Council decided to temporarily add a second crossing guard for the 2022-23 school year. At the same time, the City Council requested staff evaluate the need to continue utilizing a second crossing guard beyond the current school year. Minagar & Associates, Inc. (Minagar) was utilized to for this work, and several recommendations and alternatives are being presented to address the concerns at the intersection of Huntington Drive and Marengo Avenue.

Analysis & Discussion

In the draft evaluation of the intersection of Huntington Drive and Marengo Avenue, M&A staff identified several reoccurring concerns from residents based on the public comments, such as speed violations between 60 to 80 mph along Huntington Drive which has a 40-mph zone, limited pedestrian visibility due to vehicles parked along Huntington Drive, violation on red lights while turning left from each direction (Marengo Avenue and Huntington Drive) and making right turns without yielding to pedestrians and other concerns.

M&A reviewed the existing conditions and tabulated all collisions in City of South Pasadena from January 1, 2017 to December 31, 2021 using California Highway Patrol's (CHP) Statewide Integrated Traffic Records System (SWITRS) and UC Berkeley's Transportation Injury Mapping System (TIMS) data. The five-year data revealed that out of the 649 collisions citywide, only six (6) collisions occurred near Huntington Drive and Marengo Avenue during school time, but only a total of two (2)

involved a pedestrian or cyclist. The other four (4) collisions involved motorist versus motorist.

Furthermore, M&A performed a vehicle traffic and pedestrian counts on Thursday, September 1, 2022 during the peak hours from 7:00 am to 9:00 am and 2:00 pm to 4:00 pm to account for the school's ingress and egress. The counts revealed that the highest singular corner pedestrian counts occurred in the AM with 54 pedestrians while 23 pedestrians traversed in the PM, a 58 percent decrease. On-site observations also showed how motorists attempted to make a left turn as quickly as possible coming southbound on Marengo Avenue to eastbound Huntington Drive.

To address the core issues such as speeding and pedestrian visibility, M&A recommended 10 different solutions to mitigate speeding and increase pedestrian visibility, which could be integrated individually or collectively at Huntington Drive and Marengo Avenue.

Speed reduction treatments included:

- 1) Prohibiting right turns for vehicles during red lights
- 2) Implementing a protected left-turn signal on Marengo Avenue
- 3) Installing a pedestrian countdown signal head
- 4) Modifying signal timing for Huntington Drive-reduce the duration of the eastbound and westbound green
- 5) Increasing law enforcement presence

Visibility measures included:

- 6) Elimination of the Huntington Drive crosswalk on the west side approach
- 7) Installation of raised crosswalks on Marengo Avenue
- 8) Trimming of landscape in the center medians
- 9) Relocation of the signal controller box on the northeast corner
- 10) Modification of the signal phasing and include a leading pedestrian interval

Overall M&A determined that due to the low pedestrian volumes in the AM and PM peak hours, a second crossing guard is not warranted. Instead, M&A recommended the implementation of the aforementioned treatments individually or in combination to address the core concerns at the subject intersection.

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Introduction

Minagar & Associates, Inc. has conducted an evaluation as requested by the City of South Pasadena and its residents to assess the appropriateness of placing a second crossing guard at the Huntington Dr and Marengo Ave intersection during the 2022-2023 school year. The purpose of the study is to examine the intersection's history of collisions and danger to pedestrians and bikers and evaluate the necessity of adding a second crossing guard after considering the existing financial, safety, and convenience concerns.

Huntington Drive is an east-west principal arterial with a posted speed limit of 40 miles per hour (mph). Huntington Drive has three lanes of travel in each direction as well as left turn pocket lanes with protected turn arrows for turns onto Marengo Avenue from both directions.

Marengo Avenue is a north-south major collector with a posted speed limit of 25 mph within the study area. Marengo Avenue contains one lane of through traffic in each direction and dedicated turning lanes at both the north and south approaches to Huntington Drive, with unprotected left turn signal phases.

The location and roadway classifications of the study intersection is shown in the figure below:

EVALUATION OF SECOND CROSSING GUARD for HUNTINGTON DR AT MARENGO AVE CITY OF SOUTH PASADENA, CA



Out of eighteen (18) public comments made by parents and students and presented at the City Council Special Meeting on July 27, 2022, six (6) mentioned right turns within the intersection as a primary safety concern, while five (5) comments noted speeding and distracted driving as an issue. Additionally, pedestrian visibility and left turns were also brought up as primary concerns. Violation of red lights, speeding, and drivers' failure to account for pedestrians is the primary concern.

Specifically mentioned concerns include, but are not limited to:

- Speed violations on Huntington Dr up to 60-80 mph despite the speed limit of 40 mph
- Limited visibility of pedestrians waiting on corners due to street parking
- Violation of red lights while turning left from (northbound and/or southbound Marengo Ave to Huntington Dr
- Unprotected left turn phases on Marengo Ave
- Right turns on red from without accounting for pedestrians





Existing Conditions

Existing conditions of the Huntington Dr and Marengo Ave Intersection are shown in the following figure.



Figure 2: Driver Visibility of Huntington Dr & Marengo Ave Crosswalks






Data Collection & Analysis

To better understand the history and conditions of the Huntington Dr and Marengo Ave intersection, collision data from January 1st, 2017, to December 31st, 2021 was collected via the CHP's Statewide Integrated Traffic Records System (SWITRS) and UC Berkeley's Transportation Injury Mapping System (TIMS).


Out of six hundred forty-nine **(649)** collisions occurring in the City of South Pasadena over this period of five years, only six (6) occurred at the subject intersection during school hours, and only two **(2)** of these involved a pedestrian or bicyclist, as shown in the figures below. Detailed collision data regarding the subject intersection can be found in **Appendix A**.

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Furthermore, to observe traffic flow and pedestrian movement at the subject intersection, Minagar & Associates, Inc. collected traffic and pedestrian counts on the typical weekday of Thursday, September 1st, 2022. Counts were collected from 7:00 to 9:00am and 2:00 to 4:00pm to best represent peak drop-off and pick-up times, based on the daily schedule of Marengo Elementary School shown below. Full traffic counts, including peak hour traffic counts, can be found in *Appendix B*.

Based on the vehicle and pedestrian counts collected, a singular corner of the intersection is expected to have a maximum of 54 pedestrians during the busiest AM hour. In the afternoon, this decreases to a maximum of 23 pedestrians. With this pedestrian concentration, Minagar & Associates concludes a second crossing guard is not necessary.

Field Observations

As observed on the typical weekday of Thursday, September 1st, 2022, the crossing guard arrived at the intersection at approximately 7:45am to serve students on their way to school. However, students had already begun crossing the intersection since approximately 7:30am. The crossing guard was present at the southeast

corner of the intersection and served the crosswalks at the east and south approaches until 8:25am. In the afternoon, the crossing guard was present from approximately 2:05 until 3:15 and sufficiently, effectively and safely served students leaving school.








Figure 1: Crossing guard as observed on Thursday, Sept. 1, 2022 serving the crosswalk of the east approach of the subject intersection.

At the east approach, the crossing guard crosses about halfway through the intersection and waits for pedestrians to cross fully before returning back to the southeast corner of the intersection. Occasionally, when pedestrians cross the crosswalk at the west approach, the crossing guard follows parallelly on the east crosswalk to clearly indicate pedestrian presence and display the stop sign for vehicles.

While the crossing guard currently serves the crosswalk at the east and south approaches of the subject intersection, the pedestrian signal head at the southeast corner serving the crosswalk at the east approach,

shown in the photo on the right, does not have a pedestrian countdown to display the number of seconds left for pedestrians to cross. Subsequently, southbound vehicles turning left from Marengo Ave to Huntington Dr can get impatient and increase risk to pedestrians who are still crossing even after the "walk" phase ends.





Recommendations

As mentioned previously, concerns specifically mentioned by parents, students, and residents of South Pasadena regarding the subject intersection include, but are not limited to:

- Speed violations on Huntington Dr up to 60-80 mph despite the speed limit of 40 mph
- Limited visibility of pedestrians waiting on corners due to street parking
- Violation of red lights while turning left from (northbound and/or southbound Marengo Ave to Huntington Dr
- Unprotected left turn phases on Marengo Ave
- Right turns on red from without accounting for pedestrians

Subsequent to reviewing the core issues regarding the intersection and considering recommendations from students, residents, and council members, the following are proposed supplemental or alternative solutions to the addition of a second crossing guard.

To reduce risks from speeding and/or turning:

Prohibition of westbound right turns on red at the northeast corner
of the intersection will allow pedestrians to cross Marengo Ave
comfortably. This reduces pedestrian risk especially when drivers are
entering to drop off or pick up students and are the most rushed and/or
distracted.

2. Implementation of protected left-turn signal phases³ (S07) at the northbound and southbound left turns of Marengo Ave can reduce pedestrian risk when crossing Huntington Dr. subject to being warranted. This countermeasure reduces potential of all motor vehicle, pedestrian, and bicycle collisions and could be eligible for local funding.



3. Installation of pedestrian countdown signal heads⁴ (S17PB) will allow pedestrians and crossing guards to be aware of how much time they have to cross the intersection before it is the vehicle's right-of-way to turn. This countermeasure reduces pedestrian and bicycle collisions by 25% and is also eligible for local funding.



4. **Modification of signal phase timing** to shorten the duration of eastbound and westbound thru on Huntington Dr can reduce speeding. With these phases currently lasting a minute or longer, vehicles speeding from a further distance may run red lights rather than slowing down, putting pedestrians on the crosswalks at the east and west approaches at risk.



5. **Increased police presence** at the intersection during peak commute times according to the bell schedule of Marengo Elementary School can enforce the speed limit and reduce turning violations, thus promoting the safety and comfort of pedestrians.

To increase pedestrian visibility:

6. **Elimination of the Huntington Dr crosswalk** on the west approach to Marengo Ave will increase pedestrian concentration on the east corners of the intersection and increase pedestrian visibility to vehicles while also eliminating the need for a second crossing guard.

- 7. **Installation of raised crosswalks** on Marengo Ave can increase pedestrian visibility while also encouraging drivers to slow down as they approach the crosswalk.
- 8. **Trimming of the plantation** on the median of the west approach to Marengo Ave will increase visibility of pedestrians on the north corners of the intersection.
- Relocation of the signal controller cabinet at the northeast corner of the intersection can increase pedestrian visibility and prevent accidents as drivers turn right onto Marengo Ave
- 10. Modification of signal phasing to implement a Leading Pedestrian Interval (LPI)⁵ (S21PB) provides pedestrians the opportunity to enter an intersection 3-7 seconds before vehicles are

given a green indication. This better establishes pedestrian presence and visibility before vehicles have priority to turn. Since only minor signal timing alteration is required, costs for implementing LPIs are very low.

Conclusion

Based on the existing intersection conditions, current performance of the crossing guard, data collection and analysis, and field observations, Minagar & Associates, Inc. concludes a second crossing guard at the Huntington Dr and Marengo Ave intersection is unnecessary. Pedestrian volumes are currently manageable during the peak AM and PM hours of operations at the subject intersection with one crossing guard. While pedestrian visibility and driver behavior is a valid concern for students and/or parents walking to and from school, these issues can be better resolved by one or a combination of the options described above in the "Recommendations" section rather than a second crossing guard.

In order to meet the community's request for a second crossing guard at Huntington and Marengo, the City will have to increase the contract for crossing guard services by \$19,570. Please consider that this is less than:

- the City's purchasing authority without City Council approval;
- one day of SPPD's operations in FY 2022-2023 (\$10,684,973 / 365 = \$29,273 per day)
- four days of legal services in FY 2022-2023 (\$2,364,071 / 365 = \$6,476.90 per day)
- the one-year lease of 12 copiers that was on last week's consent calendar.

Installation of a second crossing guard at the busy intersection will make kids and parents safer when they walk to and from school -- undoubtedly, a worthwhile expenditure that comports with the City's goals of promoting community, safe streets, alternative forms of transportation, and carbon neutrality.

Commissioning a traffic study and creating a citywide crossing guard policy are great ideas. But, please add a crossing guard in the meantime. **Do not make students and parents risk their lives for another school year** while undertaking these measures.

Dear Public Safety Commissioners,

We submit this comment to request a second crossing guard at the intersection of Huntington Drive and Marengo Avenue.

In the past school year, there have been a number of near misses, wherein drivers turning onto Huntington from Marengo have almost hit children and adults. A mom had to aggressively flag down a driver to prevent him from colliding with her 9-year-old kids, on their way to school. A dad had to essentially push his child out of the way of a turning vehicle. On Friday, May 13, 2022, a father heading home from dropping off his kids was nearly struck by a speeding car turning left onto Huntington. The car swerved wildly to avoid striking him.

The intersection serves many Marengo Elementary and South Pasadena Middle and High School students who live south of Huntington. The crossing guard stationed at the southeast corner of the intersection is attentive and reliable. But this is a large, busy intersection, with six lanes of traffic to cross. Commuters treat Huntington like a highway, driving at very high speeds. There are serious risks to student pedestrians and their parents that one crossing guard cannot mitigate alone.

The City's current contract for crossing guard services is \$177,716 per year—less than two percent of the \$10 million South Pasadena Police Department annual budget. The addition of one crossing guard at Marengo and Huntington to promote the safety of our students and pedestrians is reasonable and doable.

At a similar intersection with Huntington near Valentine Elementary in San Marino, the city has stationed two crossing guards.

South Pasadena is a wonderful city for walking, with its tree-lined streets and friendly neighbors. We want to encourage our students to walk by creating a safe environment for it. We request that you recommend that City Council direct SPPD to station a second crossing guard at Marengo and Huntington.

Dear Councilmembers:

My name is Edward Seo, and I am an attorney at the largest law firm in California. I am the managing partner for the Korean Business Litigation Group in the Los Angeles office. I have represented municipalities and various school districts in California, including LAUSD. I have also litigated cases involving traffic control at busy intersections. I am currently an adjunct professor at USC Gould School of Law as well. I make this statement in support of an additional crossing guard at the intersection of Huntington Dr. and Marengo Ave. in South Pasadena (hereinafter referred to as "subject intersection").

Perhaps more germane than any other family, I own the only single-family home directly at the corner of the subject intersection. I am acutely aware of the traffic accidents that occur mere yards from my property. In fact, a speeding vehicle traveling on Huntington plowed through my property at the corner of Marengo where my kids cross the street to go to school. If not for one of my trees (which is now permanently bowed from the impact), the vehicle would have caused catastrophic damage. This is because of the sheer speed at which these vehicles travel at the subject intersection. Luckily no people were standing at the intersection at the time.

I regularly walk my two children, ages 7 and 8, to Marengo Elementary. In order to do so, we must cross Huntington, a six-lane major road with two additional turning lanes at the stoplight, totaling eight lanes at the intersection. I'm not aware of any other intersections here with that many lanes, with probably the fastest speeds of travel in all of South Pasadena.

Less than two months ago or so, I spoke with a motorcycle police officer at the subject intersection while walking my children to school. I asked him how fast the cars were traveling. The officer told me he tagged someone going in **excess of 80 mph** at the subject intersection during school crossing time. Any pedestrian accident at that speed would result in serious injury or death. Police are aware this speed is the norm rather than an aberration.

The intersection is particularly dangerous not only because of its width and fast speeds, but also because there is no left turn signal from Marengo onto Huntington. Commuters in the morning are in a rush, and oftentimes try to 'floor it' on the yield light. Unfortunately, that is the exact time our children need to cross Huntington on Marengo. Many drivers think they



can squeeze by while pedestrians are still crossing on the same side they are turning. This is incredibly dangerous and the precise reason why a second crossing guard is necessary for the health, safety and welfare of our children walking to school. Any traffic control engineer would tell you having a crossing guard would significantly reduce such unsafe turns, as well as right turns on the red light. Construction sites regularly use flaggers for this same reason, and it is proven to reduce accidents and death.

For the foregoing reasons, the city is on notice of the subject intersection, and we respectfully request a crossing guard during the limited school times as it is the most efficient way with the least amount of burden to protect our children. Thank you.

Hello and good evening City Council Members. I am Alexis Altounian, resident on Marengo Avenue just south of Huntington Drive. I am a lifelong local; now raising my daughter here. While she attends Marengo Elementary, just a few blocks away we often do not walk to school because of so many close calls and accidents that I've witnessed on Huntington Drive over the years. These close calls and accidents have happened more frequently when crossing guards are not present. My father and I would walk and run up Marengo Avenue and witness everything from people running red lights to abrupt turns in front of us in the cross walk as pedestrians.

However, one specific incident I witnessed that I wanted to share occured in the early 2000s. It was about 3pm on a school day when the crossing guard was struck by a vehicle turning right off of Marengo Avenue onto Huntington Drive who failed to stop and see her. Very fortunately the guard recovered and no children were injured. She happened to be a family friend and I immediately called her son to inform him of the accident and to let him know his mother was being transported to Huntington Hospital.

I understand we can not fix driver behavior but perhaps we can make the cross walk more visible to drivers and safer for pedestrians. I feel that having two crossing guards working in tandem to keep the intersection as safe as possible to and from school would be a significant improvement and beneficial to our community.

Chair Fisher called the Regular Meeting of the Mobility and Transportation Infrastructure Commission (MTIC) to order on March 21, 2023, at 6:34 p.m. The meeting was held in-person and virtually via Zoom.

PUBLIC COMMENT AND SUGGESTIONS

1. Public Comment – General

- 1. Mary Hoban She is a resident of Golden Oaks Apartment. She expressed concern regarding entering and exiting the garage is unsafe and is requesting that something be done.
- 2. Sally Kilby She is a resident of Golden Oaks Apartment. She expressed concern regarding the entering and exiting the garage is unsafe. Ms. Kilby suggested several ideas for consideration including but not limited to installing a camera at the corner of Mission Street and Diamond Avenue, and active enforcement during Farmers Market to include towing of vehicles.

3. Planning "State of Streets" Joint Council & MTIC Meeting – April 19th, 2023

PWD Gerber presented the upcoming State of Streets study session with City Council and MTIC which will be held on Wednesday, April 26, 2023 at 6:30p.m. This is an opportunity to share ideas, concerns and prioritization of street projects. The discussion topics will be as follows:

- Pavement Management Program
- Pavement Condition Index Process & Next Iteration
- Street Improvement Projects Phases and Status
- Transportation Capital Improvement Projects
- Master Planning Effort
- Fund Sources

Discussion ensued regarding striping improvements, cool streets, climate and greenhouse gas reduction, pavement markings, and curb ramps.

Chair Fisher suggested it would be helpful to have a map that includes the improvements over the last six years and then another map showing the streets programmed for the next number of years.

4. Review of Measure R Mobility Improvement Project: Fair Oaks SR-110 Interchange Loop Ramp PWD Gerber presented a brief overview of this project.

Discussion ensued regarding the project details.

6. Selection of Officers

A motion was made by Commissioner Abelson and seconded by Chair Fisher to nominate Commissioner Dunlap as Chair. (4-0 motion passes)

A motion was made by Chair Fisher and seconded by Commission Abelson to nominate Commissioner Hughes as Vice-Chair. Commissioner Hughes volunteered to continue to review the minutes. (4-0 motion passes)

COMMUNICATIONS

7. City Council Liaison Communications

Council Liaison Donovan informed the Commission of the first joint session meeting with the Finance Commission to approve the mid-year budget process. He updated the Commission on the Caltrans properties and that the ad hoc committee received the bids back for the remodeling of the unoccupied homes and reviewed the estimates. Council Liaison Donovan stated that they are waiting on Caltrans to notify the city of who will be returning or renting to the homes currently owned by Caltrans. He announced that Little League opened on Friday night with over a thousand people in attendance and his concern is getting rid of the gopher holes at Arroyo Park.

8. Commissioner Communications

Commissioner Hughes thanked staff for the presentation and consolidated report. She requested that staff keep the commission informed regarding the "drop off" with Holy Family. She informed staff that the potholes on the northbound SR-110 Freeway leading to the Orange Grove Avenue off ramp are back due to the rains and if Caltrans can be notified. Commissioner Hughes expressed concern with water conservation and appreciates the continued work by staff.

Commissioner Zavala announced that he received his driver's license and how that has given him a wider perspective not just as a biker or a pedestrian and gives him an understanding of the habits of drivers, however he would continue to ride his bike.

Chair Fisher suggested for the joint meeting to have snapshots of the large potholes to emphasis if the city doesn't fund repaving at critical points and the roadway deteriorates very rapidly, but if you catch it before that point the city saves a lot of money. He's pleased with the South Pasadena sign and how the recent rains and the growth around the letters has framed it nicely.

Commissioner Abelson thanked staff for the presentation and report. He welcomed Councilmember Donovan and congratulated Commissioner Zavala on receiving his driver's license. Commissioner Abelson thanked outgoing Chair Fisher for his leading the meetings, guiding the conversation and working with staff on the agendas. Caltrans repaired a nice impressive segment, which was riddled with holes, but there's another segment further south that needs repair of the Orange Grove Avenue on-ramp southbound. The intersection of State Street and Raymondale has a constantly blinking red traffic signal and if the signals could be repurposed to another location where it could be used.

PWD Gerber stated its difficult to repurpose because the signals are custom design especially as it comes to wind loading.

9. Staff Communications

PWD Gerber stated the City is planning an outreach meeting for the North-South Corridor project and will be held in the Library Community room, the date to be determined. The City has another outreach meeting plan for the stormwater wetland project, to bring cleaner water into the city to use for irrigation. This will be held on Thursday, April 27 at 6:00p.m. at the Library Community room. It's a joint meeting with Pasadena, and our project consultants to answer question and to conduct a walk through. We are targeting to begin construction before the end of this year. The Commission Congress will be held on Wednesday, June 28th. PWD Gerber mentioned the commission will start the discussion of the annual report and work plan for the next fiscal year, which will be agendized on a future meeting.

PWA DeWiitt announced the Annual Dumpster Day Event scheduled for Saturday, April 15, from 8a.m. to 2p.m, on Arroyo Drive, south of Mission Street. For seniors, please contact the Senior Center at 626-403-7360 to register.
