SUBJECT: Project Status Update

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Commission receive and file an update on the status of projects related to the City's mobility and transportation infrastructure.

Information

Public Works projects are generally divided into two areas: (1) Capital Improvement Program (CIP) projects and (2) routine or special Operations & Maintenance (O&M) projects. Ongoing or planned projects related to mobility and transportation infrastructure in both of these areas, along with their recent status, are listed in the tables below.

Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Projects	Project Status
Mission and Fremont Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons Budget: Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) \$238,465, Measure M Local Return \$26,497	Updated Status Staff working to release bid with an update from the design consultant. This project installs Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFBs) at Fremont Avenue and Lyndon Street, Mission Street and Diamond Avenue, and Mission Street and Fairview Avenue. The design consultant has provided a scope and fee to implement the necessary updates to the bid package – a contract is in the process of being executed, with the negotiation of terms and conditions now complete.
Street Improvements Budget: General Fund \$298,445, Proposition C \$300,000, Gas Tax \$200,000, Measure R Local Return \$300,000, Measure M Local Return \$177,565, SB1 \$585,093, Bike & Pedestrian \$25,000 Total 3,886,103	Updated Status Design Consultant and Project Management Consultant working to release first bid package. Staff and Project Management Consultant. The first of several bid packages to be released this fiscal year will include reconstruction projects along Monterey Road from Pasadena Avenue to the West City Limit, Alta Vista Avenue from Indiana Avenue to Oak Crest Avenue, Forest Avenue from Mission Street to the End of the Street, and Sterling Place from Floral Park Terrace of the End of the Street. Staff will review the remaining streets to be reconstructed and resurfaced with the Commission in a future meeting. A map showing the initial proposal for the future street program area configuration (Attachment 1) is being presented at this 9/19 Commission meeting.

Measure M Project Funding Requests	No Significant Update New projects to be considered in FY 23-24. The Commission will review new proposed projects in FY 23-24 to submit for the 2024 project request cycle.
Grevelia Street and Fair Oaks Avenue Measure M Project Budget: Measure M MSP \$200,000	Updated Status Scope of work begin drafted, Funding Agreement to be executed. Staff are working with a Metro representative to file the documents necessary in order to execute a funding agreement (MM5506.06). Staff met with Caltrans to discuss requirements related to the lane changes recommended at the SR-110 freeway exit. Staff is drafting a scope of work that will be used as part of the Funding Agreement with Metro.
Orange Grove Avenue Widening from Oliver Street to Arroyo Seco Park Budget: Measure M MSP \$500,000	Updated Status Funding Agreement to be executed. Staff are working with a Metro representative to file the documents necessary in order to execute a funding agreement (MM5506.08). Upon approving the funding submittal, City Council directed staff to explore the feasibility of alternatives to the widening. A document provided during the Public Comments during the August 15, 2023 meeting related to this item is included as Attachment 2.
Pedestrian Crossing Devices Budget: Measure M MSP \$322,624	New Project Funding Agreement to be executed. Staff are working with a Metro representative to file the documents necessary in order to execute a funding agreement (MM4101.11). Staff is drafting a scope of work that will be used as part of the Funding Agreement with Metro. MTIC recommended crossing locations and will prioritize three intersections Fair Oaks/Spruce, Meridian/Bank, and Grevelia/Park.
Columbia Street Striping & Signal Improvements Budget: Measure M MSP \$300,000	No Significant Update \$9.9M in Measure R Mobility Improvement Project (MIP) Funds were approved by Metro and Pasadena City Council included the project in the City CIP. On May 8, 2023 the City of Pasadena's Council determined Pasadena's funded project to be in conformance with the City's General Plan. City staff will work with Pasadena DOT to determine the next steps to move this project forward. Staff are working with a Metro representative to file the documents necessary in order to execute South Pasadena's Measure M MSP funding agreement (MM5506.07).

Garfield Avenue and Monterey Road Traffic Signal	No Significant Update Staff to conduct feasibility work. Staff plan to conduct the necessary warrant analysis of the signal in order to fulfill the feasibility requirements of the funding source, before resubmitting the project to Metro.
Fremont/Huntington Mobility Active Transportation & Mobility Improvement Projects Budget: Measure M MAT \$6M, Measure M MIP \$10M	Updated Status Near-term improvements continue. The planning and community charrette process is starting next week on September 25, 2023. Staff has been meeting with residents along Huntington and Fremont, as well as adjacent neighborhoods, to discuss project status and next steps. Staff and the CM's office recently distributed outreach material to stakeholders and residents. Staff also secured the Library Community room, and is coordinating equipment and supplies for the first week. Documents, studies and reports were supplied to the consultant for further reviewThe scope of the task order is to conduct the first phase of the planning process, including a comprehensive multi-day charrette for the three corridors: Fremont Avenue, Huntington Drive, and Fair Oaks Avenue. In addition, a number of near-term improvements have been completed by staff including markings and installation of traffic calming devices.
City of Pasadena 'Stub' Relinquishment / Transitional Project Development & City of Alhambra I-10 Modifications	Updated Status Discussion with Alhambra and Pasadena. South Pasadena, Pasadena, and Alhambra staff held an initial discussion, and are scheduling follow up meetings. The City of Alhambra approved a Measure R funding agreement with Metro for the Fremont Ramp and Interchange Improvements. Staff provided an update to Council on the status of the Pasadena re-visioning process and the 'Advancing Alhambra' projects. On Monday, 9/11, Pasadena Council considered a contract for strategic planning and project management services for the relinquished 710 stub area. City Manager team also made a presentation to Council regarding the status of the project.

Sidewalks Replacement & ADA Ramps Upgrades Budget: TBD	Staff met with the Los Angeles County Development Authority Community Development Division to ensure the funding requirements are met and to program funding for the next fiscal years. The outcome of the meeting was direction to expand the scope of the project to expend more funding in Fiscal Year 2023-2024. Staff are proposing to include improvements at these locations: • Amberwood at Raymondale (North & South) • Amberwood at Mockingbird • Oxley at Fairview
North-South Corridor	Updated Status Caltrans signed off on the Preliminary Environment Study (PES) awaiting feedback on completed Preliminary Environmental.
Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) Deployment Project	Staff submitted the completed Preliminary Environmental Study to Caltrans' Division of Environmental Analysis and received a signed copy. Caltrans requested an Air Quality Study and Cultural Resource Report. The Consultant KOA prepared the Air Quality Report, APE
Budget: \$9M Rogan Funds, \$1.4 General Fund	Narrative and Map. Staff is reviewing the documents the consultant prepared. Staff are also reviewing the feedback from the public outreach meeting for consideration into the project's direction, and will discuss these updates with the Commission at a future meeting.
	No Significant Update Potential grant funding opportunity identified.
Farmer's Market Bollard System	This future proposed project is listed in the 5-Year Capital Improvement Program (CIP). Staff is currently exploring an available funding opportunity for this project. The project is scheduled for implementation in Fiscal Year 2024-2025.
Fair Oaks SR-110	Updated Status Alternative study scope developed. The item was being presented to the Commission on 8/15.
Interchange Loop/Hook On-Ramp	A professional services on-call consultant has developed a scope of work to complete the Project Approval and Environmental Document (PA/ED) project phase. Staff presented this item at the August 15, 2023 meeting, and recommended the consultant and City staff will
Budget: Measure M MIP \$70 Million	coordinate a meeting with Metro and Caltrans to discuss near-term study work and the use of Measure R Mobility Improvement Project (MIP) funding. The Commission provided comments on the scope of work which staff will provide to the consultant.

Fair Oaks SR-110 Interchange Loop/Hook Grevelia Off-Ramp Budget: See above	<u>Updated Status</u> Alternative study scope being developed. See above "Fair Oaks SR-110 Interchange Loop/Hook On-Ramp" status.
Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) Cycle 11 Projects Budget: TBD	No Significant Update Recently awarded grant funding. On March 9, 2023, South Pasadena was awarded over \$500,000 in HSIP funding for four (4) projects submitted in Fall 2022 related to street lighting, bike lanes, and pedestrian crossing improvements at multiple locations: The intersection of Monterey Road and Fremont Avenue and the intersection of Fair Oaks Avenue and Grevelia Street south of the 110 Freeway on and off-ramps to improve traffic signal timing and hardware, add intersection lighting (\$32,350). The intersection of Fremont Avenue and Huntington Drive for the addition of bike lanes, installation of pedestrian countdown signals, and addition of lighting (\$50,040). Fremont Avenue from Columbia Street to Monterey Road to add street lighting, install flashing beacons at stop-controlled intersection, install curve advance warning signs (\$277,110). Huntington Drive from Leman Street to Maple Street to install bike lanes, and add street lighting (\$181,260). These HSIP projects will be coordinated with the Fremont/Huntington Mobility Active Transportation & Mobility Improvement Projects.

2023-2024 Slow Streets & Open Streets Program	<u>Updated Status</u> Consultant team is preparing the first pilot parklet installation which will be reviewed by Cultural Heritage Commission. Residential installation is complete.
Budget: General Fund \$150,000 SGVCOG Grant: \$45,000	An initial 'pilot' parklet will be installed ahead of the street design and equipment roll-out in front of Jones Coffee Roasters. The proposed design of this parklet is being presented at this 9/19 Commission Meeting and at the 9/21 Cultural Heritage Commission Meeting. Mission Street reconfiguration is being presented to the Commission for recommendation at this 9/19 meeting.

	No Significant Update Software workflow development underway. City Council approval of the amended software contract is required.
Neighborhood Traffic Management Program (NTMP) Implementation	Staff are working with the contracted software system designer to implement the NTMP online processing forms. The implementation requires a contract amendment to the software development agreement, which is expected to be before Council for approval in August. While the implementation is underway, staff continue to receive and process requests from the community related to neighborhood traffic management.
Ramona Avenue, Oak Street, Rollin Street, & Fremont Avenue Traffic Management	Updated Status Drop-off and Pick-Up 5-minute zone was installed at the end of August 2023. Public Works staff engaged with the City Manager's Office staff to facilitate the distribution of outreach material to parents/students through the School District; a flyer was developed identifying the new drop-off and pick-up zone. Staff also coordinated with the School District and Parent-Teacher Association to distribute the flyer. The necessary signage and curb painting were installed. In addition, Public Works staff and Community Development staff are working out the process to address community concerns related to traffic issues in this area.
	No Significant Update Pending task order issuance.
Meridian Avenue Traffic Management & Safety Measures	Staff have evaluated the site conditions and traffic data to discuss potential improvements to Meridian Avenue. This information was presented at the July 2022 MTIC meeting, and the Commission provided feedback. A study will be conducted, including a speed survey, which will be coordinated with local stakeholders. A task order is being issued to a professional services on-call consultant for this work. Recently, the pedestrian crossing at Meridian and Bank has been refreshed with new paint and a new sign. The nearby City trees have been trimmed and residents have been notified by mail to trim nearby privately-owned overgrown trees.



	No Significant Update Task order being executed.
Timing Improvements at the Metro Gold Line Mission & Meridian	Staff previously met with MTIC's Chair to review recommendations regarding the timing of signal lights and railway crossing gates at Mission and Meridian. Metro has provided a contact for timing issues to work with the City, however, Metro requires more information on the matter to troubleshoot the solution. If necessary, a task order to update the timing sheets for this location will be issued to a professional services on-call consultant. The task order work would also reconcile the City's previously requested preemption changes with the known timing issues.
Timing Improvements at Orange Grove & Monterey Signal	Project Completed Work Completed. City maintenance contractor uploaded the new traffic signal timing and adjusted the video call detectors in all directions.
Timing Improvements at Mission & Garfield	Project Completed Work Completed. The intersection operates on a fixed time, and has no loop detectors, ped heads and no push buttons. City maintenance contractor uploaded the new traffic signal timing.
Fremont Avenue Southbound Left Turn Pocket South of Huntington Drive Intersection	No Significant Update Work scope being developed. A task order to develop a striping plan for this project is being issued to a professional services on-call consultant. The striping plan will remove the 'no left turn' marking a create left-turn pocket to access business at the Southeast corner of Fremont Avenue and Huntington Drive. This Commission recommended project will be incorporated into the planning process for the Fremont/Huntington Mobility Active Transportation & Mobility Improvement Projects.
Traffic & Parking Impacts along Glendon Way between El Centro Street and Meridian Avenue	No Significant Update Pending staff discussion with the Chamber. City Council recently approved a new five-year agreement with the Chamber of Commerce that contains updated language to facilitate review of the Farmer's Market event Parking Management Plan. Public Works will work with the Chamber of Commerce to adjust with the goal of improving traffic and parking impacts along Glendon Way.

Replacement of Missing Orange Grove Street Lamps	No Significant Update Pending staff cost estimate.
	Staff are developing a cost estimate to replace the Orange Grove Street Lamps, and relocating the lamps away from the street where possible.
Early Action Projects (EAP) List	No Significant Update Measure R Mobility Improvement Projects (MIP) were discussed at the November 2022 MTIC Meeting, where some elements of the "SR 710 Early Action Projects (EAP)" are planned to be addressed in the North-South Corridor Intelligent Transportation Systems Project, and the current Measure R programmed projects include the Fair Oaks SR-110 Interchange Loop/Hook On-Ramp and Off-Ramp projects and the Fremont/Huntington Mobility Active Transportation Project (see above items). "Early Action Projects (EAP) List". EAPs do not have committed funding and will be kept on this list for future tracking.
Installation of City Limit Signs at Various Locations	No Significant Update Pending task order issuance. A task order to develop a conceptual plan for this project is being issued to a professional services on-call consultant.
	No Significant Update Pending General Plan Update.
Preferential Parking Policy	As a City Council Strategic Plan goal, Staff will work with Community Development in this area, considering recommendations provided by MTIC. Work will commence after the General Plan and Downtown Specific Plan are completed.
2023 626 Golden Streets Arroyo Fest (October 29, 2023)	<u>Updated Status</u> Memorandum of Understanding with the San Gabriel Valley Council of Government (SGVCOG) is being considered on the September 27, 2023 City Council Agenda.
Budget: In-Kind Staff Time Match \$19,000	Staff is working with ActiveSGV to finalize the traffic control plans, an execute a memorandum of agreement outlining event responsibilities – which will be brought to City Council for approval on September 27, 2023. The MOU establishes a budget for City expenses, as well as other coordination details.
	Updated Status Proposed development traffic study complete.
Traffic Impact Analyses	The developer team completed a traffic evaluation for a proposed project southwest of Fair Oaks and Grevelia.

	Project Completed Work Completed.
Huntington Drive at Marengo Avenue Crossing Guard Evaluation	Public Works and the Police Department prepared a joint staff report. The City Council approved a second crossing guard at Huntington and Marengo and extended and approved the crossing guard contract. Recommendations provided in the report will be incorporated into the planning process for the Fremont/Huntington Mobility Active Transportation & Mobility Improvement Projects.
	No Significant Update Project Underway.
Marengo Avenue Traffic Safety Assessment Budget: Measure M Local Return \$39,030	Staff revised the scope for the comprehensive traffic safety review along the Marengo Avenue corridor based on feedback from MTIC and residents who submitted comments. The consultant provided a revised scope and fee that includes traffic counts, speed data, and stop compliance surveys at additional locations, as well as an evaluation of traffic island diverters, and an evaluation of the intersection at Alhambra Road. The task order was approved by City Council on July 19, 2023. The evaluation will capture the school-related traffic and pedestrian impacts.
	Updated Status Staff working to implement MTIC recommended edge striping. The planning and community charrette process is scheduled to start the week of September 25, 2023
Huntington Drive 2000 Block Review	Staff is finalizing the contract agreement and is routing the contract for signatures and contractor to install an Edge Line striping along the south side of Huntington Drive from Dos Robles to Olive Street as recommended by the Commission. Staff and the CM's office recently distributed outreach material to stakeholders and residents. Staff also secured the Library Community room, and is coordinating equipment and supplies for the first week. Documents, studies and reports were supplied to the consultant for further review.
	No Significant Update Review of community suggestions and enforcement.
Diamond Avenue Improvements	Staff are reviewing improvements suggested by community members along Diamond Avenue between Mission Street and El Centro. The Police Department has been enforcing parking restrictions and Public Works refreshed the existing red curb paint along the roadway.



Public Comments Submission

Orange Grove Design

Originally part of the 710 freeway mitigation projects, synchronizing the signals to improve flow off of the north bound 110




Two lanes headed south into SP at Columbia




The two south bound lanes then merge as the drivers enter a curve to the right



The merge arrows direct the #2 lane to merge left into a single lane #1



The merge to the left as indicated by the arrows pushes the momentum of the vehicles toward the median.



The travel lane curve flows traffic momentum into median #2



The oversize single lane allows for vehicles to drift toward the center or outward due to momentum

Suggested corrections

Request that the City of Pasadena merge the two south bound lanes north of Columbia so only a single south bound lane crosses at Columbia

Change the #2 lane to Right Turn only onto west bound Columbia, example as done on east bound Mission St at Fair Oaks and at east bound Monterey Rd at Fair Oaks

Remove the directional arrows for the merge to the #1 lane, to arrows that direct flow to the right to direct flow to the curve.

Restripe the single south bound lane with lane narrowing striping centered in the path.
