









AIR POLLUTION IN SOUTH COAST REGION Particulate Matter 2.5 (PM2.5) OZONE (aka SMOG) • ULTRAFINE .1µm (microns) combustion PM 2.5
Combustion particles, organic compounds, metals, etc.

CALL TO ORDER:

The Meeting of the South Pasadena Natural Resources and Environmental Commission was called to order by Chair Michael Siegel on Tuesday, January 23, 2024, at 7:00 P.M. in the City Council Chambers, 1424 Mission Street, South Pasadena, California.

Angelo Gladding shared his concerns regarding the tree code in the City's Housing Element.

Arpy Kasparian, Environmental Services & Sustainability Manager, presented on the sustainability programs and initiatives in place such as the Water Conservation Program, Climate Action Plan, the ban on Gas-Powered Leaf Blowers, and SB 1383.

Ted Gerber, Public Works Director, shared an update on programs in place such as the City Hall Electrification, SCE Charge Ready Program, Mound Parking Lot Solar Project, and Huntington Green Street Stormwater Project.

COMMUNICATIONS

5. CITY COUNCIL LIAISON COMMUNICATIONS

Councilmember Cacciotti discussed the City's accomplishments and ongoing electrification projects within and outside of the City. He touched on the advancements made with the ban on gas-powered leaf blowers, highlighting the collaboration with AGZA. Councilmember Cacciotti also shared updates with the LA Metro Gold Line.

6. COMMISSIONER COMMUNICATIONS

Commissioner Tom had no comments.

Commissioner Law shared his gratitude for the Public Works Staff for joining the Arroyo Vista Elementary School STEM Night.

Commissioner Jones thanked City Staff for their efforts with the ban on gas-powered leaf blowers and shared that the noise has significantly reduced in her neighborhood. She also stressed that she has observed residents utilizing artificial turf and suggested alternatives due to the heat island effect caused by the artificial turf.

Chair Siegel encouraged viewers to visit Transition South Pasadena's upcoming event at the Community Garden on Saturday, January 27, 2024.

Commissioner de Villa Bourke discussed his observations of the increased security and scanning of cards on the Metro.

Commissioner Ng shared that she was previously a youth commissioner. She also promoted an open seat on the Los Angeles County Youth Climate Commission in District 5.

Environmental Services & Sustainability Manager, Arpy Kasparian, thanked previous Commission members, Ella Hushagen and Michelle Hammond, for their service and welcomed new Commission members, Liam R. de Villa Bourke and Emily Ng.
