SUBJECT: Proposed Removal of Trees at 702 Fremont Avenue

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Natural Resources and Environmental Commission approve the removal of ten non-native trees and one mature native oak tree at 702 Fremont Avenue.

Background

On December 12, 2022, the applicant submitted a private property tree removal/replacement permit application. (Attachment 1). Through the application process and visits to the site with City staff, the applicant identified eleven trees for removal, including one significant non-native tree, nine non-significant non-native trees, and one mature oak tree. Initially the submitted application included fewer trees, however the applicant identified additional trees while reviewing the site with staff. All eleven trees are identified in the application inventory and arborist report. Staff recommended approval of all eleven trees. A draft replacement plan is included in the attached documents. A public notice was mailed to owners and tenants within a 100-foot radius of the subject property to receive comments and the City received one objection during the notification period.

Discussion/Analysis

Per SPMC 34.9(a)(6), staff requested an arborist report to identify the condition of all trees on the property. An arborist report was received on January 30, and is included as Attachment 2. Tree removals associated with development shall only be conditionally approved subject to the applicant receiving their development building permit, paying all fees associated with the tree removal as established by resolution of the city council, and paying a deposit in the amount of \$2,345 for the seven (7) replacement trees. Upon the planning review authority's approval of the development application and satisfaction of all conditions of approval, and payment of all required fees, the applicant shall be issued a tree removal permit, SPMC 34.10(5).

Fiscal Impact

The applicant has paid the initial tree removal inspection fee of \$134.00 and will be required to pay any permit fees for the permit.

PRIVATE PROPERTY TREE REMOVAL/REPLACEMENT PERMIT CONDITIONS:

- (1) Conditions must exist to warrant the removal of any mature tree. Healthy trees which are not causing a hardship on the property owner shall not be approved for removal.
- (2) Tree removals will include complete removal of the stump and backfill of the hole.
- (3) For every tree approved for removal, multiple replacement trees must be planted anywhere on the owner's property or on City's property upon City's approval. For replacement tree(s) planted in the parkway, root barriers will be required to control the root system. The size of the replacement tree(s) is (are) based on the diameter of the trunk and the type of tree(s) for removal. The replacement tree(s) must be a minimum of 24" box size or as specified by the Engineering Division.
- (4) Replacement trees must be planted within 90 days of the issuance date on the permit.
- (5) Prior to planting the replacement trees, a final inspection must be conducted by the City inspector to verify conformance with tree replacement requirements. Please call to schedule an appointment at (626) 403-7370, Monday through Thursday, 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.
- (6) A 100-foot radius map and mailing labels shall be required to provide public notice of the tree removal. Residents within a 100-foot radius of the property shall be given 15-days to comment on the tree removal prior to issuance of the permit.



To Whom It May Concern:

INTRODUCTION

On Tuesday, January 24th 2023 I visited the above-referenced property in order to inventory and evaluate the existing tree stock so as to prepare this Report and the accompanying Index of Trees wherein the individual specimens are assigned a code letter, are described as to species, diameter at standard height (DSH), height, spread and condition as well as two Modified Tree Site Plans, one of which shows the location of each of the existing specimens and another that represents the tree population that will remain after the proposed removals.

Those documents will collectively constitute a component of the application for permits to develop this property as per the plans already in the City's possession.

OVERVIEW

Onsite we find a total of 14 trees that may be separated into 3 divisions:

I. Healthy trees requiring removal for the projected development to proceed:

TREE C, a Rubber Tree (Ficus elastica).

TREE E, a Coast Live Oak (Quercus agrifolia).

TREEs F and O, both Pecans (Carya illinoinensis) and

TREE J, an in mature Black Acacia (Acacia melanoxylon).

II. Dead, toppled, decayed or structure-challenging trees destined to be removed:

TREE G, a Jacaranda (*Jacaranda mimosifolia*) abutting the structure.

TREE K, a sprawling Rubber Tree (*Ficus elastica*) with extensive basal decay


TREE I, a Black Acacia (*Acacia melanoxylon*) sited over-close to the foundation and

TREEs L, M and N, Black Acacias (*Acacia melanoxylon*), all evincing butt-rot.

III. Healthy trees being retained:

TREE A, a mature Canary Island Palm (*Phoenix canarensis*) and TREEs B, D and G, 3 Mexican Fan Palms (*Washingtonia robusta*).

OBSERVATIONS

I have been informed that the question of removal of the trees facing elimination has already been brought forward to the City and that, if permission is granted to remove these trees, an agreement as to an off-site planting program has been reached which should satisfy the City's requirements for replacing eliminated trees with new specimens but that all of those replacement plantings will occur away from the property in question.

That being the case, this report and its accompanying documents will serve as a record of the existing tree stock but do not concern themselves with the projected future offset plantings.

Thanks for your time and attention to these matters and please feel free to reach out if I may provide any additional information.





SUBJECT: Agreement to Terms Regarding Tree Removal Application for 702 Fremont St.

To Whom it May Concern,

This letter serves as a statement of agreement to terms for tree removal as found in the South Pasadena Municipal Code, that the owners were directed to by South Pasadena Department of Public Works in a meeting on March 15, 2023.

The licensed arborist for the project at 702 Fremont St. has indicated (see "Report on Existing Tree Stock" by The Urban Lumberjack), a total of eleven (11) trees are proposed for removal. Of these, six (6) are "Dead, toppled, decayed or structure-challenging trees" which require removal. The remaining five (5) trees, two of which are unplanned volunteer trees that took root over years of property neglect by previous owners, have been deemed as healthy - however their current location prevent further by-right development of the parcel, namely in the form of an Accessory Dwelling Unit. Our team did try to retain more trees, namely the oak facing Magnolia St., however their placements within the site made any realistic development impossible.

The owners are devoted to transforming the property for the betterment of the neighborhood, and propose to follow the requirements for tree removal as set forth by the city of South Pasadena. As an affirmation of their devotion to the neighborhood and restoration of the site, they propose to plant a combination of seven (7) 'native' and 'drought tolerant' trees on and abutting the parcel (see Proposed Site Plan) upon the approval of Public Works. Further, the proposed two (2) new oak trees will be of a 36" box size, whereas a 24" box for replacement trees is standard. They also agree to pay any agreed upon fee for the remainder of required replacement trees, to be planted by the city of South Pasadena at a location of their choosing.


However, the owners also request relief from the total number of tree replacements per code, given the condition of those trees which are toppled, dead or in dire condition, as listed in the arborist's report, especially given the fact that the site was neglected for so long before they acquired it. It should also be noted that of the eleven (11) trees proposed for removal, ten (10) are neither designated as 'native' nor 'drought tolerant'.

Re: 702 Fremont Avenue, Proposed Tree Removal

Deputy Director of Public Works:

I have received the attached letter regarding proposed tree removal at 702 Fremont Avenue. Please note that due to slow mailing and perhaps the holiday season, I only received this one week ago despite the mentioned 15-calendar-day comment period.

The letter includes a table that indicates the proposed removal of nine trees, seven of which can likely be considered mature due to a diameter of 6" or greater (assumed to be, but not listed as, DBH or diameter at breast height). The reason given for each is merely "New Construction", which lacks any useful detail. Also, the letter does not provide the number of trees to be retained (i.e., protected in place).

I hereby object to the removal of the trees without some justification for the need to remove. South Pasadena, the "City of Trees", has a history of architects and designers working to retain as many mature trees as possible when remodeling or redeveloping a site. In particular, the oak tree (the letter did not indicate the species) deserves some special consideration. Both the State of California and County of Los Angeles have recognized the oak tree as a "significant historical, aesthetic, and ecological resource". The County Code generally prohibits the removal of any tree of the oak genus that is 25" or more in circumference (8" in diameter); your letter's table shows the oak tree diameter at 8".

While I am not opposed to any tree removals at 702 Fremont, I believe that each removal should be considered on its individual need, tree by tree, with greater consideration given to the oak. The combination of proposed new trees, select tree removal, sensitive site design, and architectural massing should be evaluated together to determine appropriateness. The typical land clearing, clean slate approach (that is easier for architects and contractors) usually results in a multitude of smallish, staked box trees and is not appropriate for South Pasadena or this mature, established neighborhood.

Approval of Minutes – Special Meeting of December 5, 2022

CITY OF SOUTH PASADENA NATURAL RESOURCES AND ENVIRONMENTAL COMMISSION – SPECIAL MEETING MINUTES – December 5, 2022

CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. Present at the time of roll call were: Chair Law, Vice Chair Hammond, Commissioner Ella Hushagen, Commissioner Rona Bortz Commissioner, Michael Siegel, and Commissioner Richard Tom. Commissioner Amy Davis Jones had an excused absence. Staff present: Ted Gerber: Public Works Director, and Melanis Stepanian: Water Conservation and Sustainability Intern. City Council Liaison Councilmember Michael Cacciotti was absent.

1) General Public Comment

No general public comment.

PUBLIC HEARINGS:

2) Continued Tree Hearing- 1865 Hanscom Drive

Ted Gerber, Public Works Director, shared a brief background of the Tree Hearing for 1865 Hanscom Drive from the October 25 NREC Meeting. He also spoke about the site visits that were set up for the Commissioners to attend. During these site visits, Commissioners were required to attend in groups of 3 or fewer in order to be in accordance with the Brown Act. Site visits were also open to the community members to attend.

Commissioners who were able to attend the site visit shared their observations with the Commission Members and the public. Commissioner Hushagen questioned the independent arborist's qualifications and licenses. Commissioner Tom expressed how important having a development plan is for this project. Chair Law asked a few questions regarding the Municipal Code.

After the public comment section, Commissioners asked Ted Gerber, Public Works Director, clarifying questions regarding the Municipal Code before making a motion.

PUBLIC COMMENT

There were 6 written public comments, included in the additional documents, and 7 in-person public comments referring to the 1865 Hanscom Drive agenda item. In-person comments are summarized below.

- -Wendy Ryan, speaking on behalf of herself and many neighbors, who are in opposition to removing the trees without extensive research on the tree's health.
- -Angelo Gladding discussed his concern with the City processes for tree removal on a property without development plans.
- -Charles Imbus, the property owner, shared his opinion regarding the trees' health and a recap of the walkthrough with the City arborist accompanying his own arborist.
- -Laura Gladding shared her concerns about the "tree replacement" requirements in the City of South Pasadena which does not require trees to be replaced on the property they are removed from.
- -A resident living in a nearby community shared her experience with mudslides she believes are caused by tree removal. If a tree has a disease, it is understandable to remove the tree.

- -Another resident shared how important tree roots are for hillside communities because they provide structure.
- -Adrian Imbus, who will be moving into the proposed development, says that the trees on the property are dead or dying and the stumps will be left behind for structural purposes.

MOTION BY COMMISSIONER TOM, SECOND BY COMMISSIONER HAMMOND, MOTION CARRIED 6-0, RECOMMENDING STAFF TO WORK WITH THE APPLICANT TO SUBMIT A TREE REPLACEMENT PLAN IDENTIFYING THE APPLICANT'S INTENTION WITH CITY REPLACEMENT REQUIREMENTS FOR THE 4 TREES. THIS PLAN WILL BE REVIEWED AND DISCUSSED AT A FUTURE NREC MEETING BEFORE APPROVING THE TREE REMOVAL APPLICATION FOR 1865 HANSCOM DRIVE.

4) City Council Liaison Communications

City Council Liaison, Mayor Michael Cacciotti, was absent from this meeting.

5) Commissioner Communications

Commissioners discussed the open appointment for the Recreation Lease Ad Hoc Committee member due to changes in NREC. An NREC Commission Member is to be appointed for the vacant position.

Commissioner Hushagen shared the Active SGV program which allows interested parties to receive an electric bike at an affordable rate.

6) Staff Liaison Communications

Ted Gerber discussed updates regarding the study of The West Side Reservoir from the Public Works Commission Meeting. Mobility and Transportation Commission hosted a public discussion about a large transportation project.

Melanis Stepanian shared a few updates regarding events in the City. There will be an Electric Leaf Blower event on Wednesday, February 8th. Residents are encouraged to drop in anytime between 8am-1pm. Refreshments will be provided.

Approval of Minutes – Meeting of January 24, 2023

CITY OF SOUTH PASADENA NATURAL RESOURCES AND ENVIRONMENTAL COMMISSION – REGULAR MEETING MINUTES – January 24, 2023

CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order at 7:01 p.m. Present at the time of roll call were: Chair Casey Law, Commissioner Rona Bortz, Commissioner Amy Davis Jones, Commissioner Michael Siegel, and Commissioner Richard Tom. Commissioner Ella Hushagen and Councilmember Michael Cacciotti, City Council Liaison, arrived late to the meeting. Vice Chair Hammond had an excused absence. Staff present: Ted Gerber: Public Works Director, and Melanis Stepanian: Water Conservation and Sustainability Intern.

1) General Public Comment

There was one written public comment submitted.

No other general public comments were received.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

2) Green Action Plan Update- Ted Gerber, Public Works Director Ted Gerber, Public Works Director, briefed the Commissioners with an update of the South Pasadena Green Action Plan. (South Pasadena Green Action Plan | South Pasadena, CA (southpasadenaca.gov)) The Green Action Plan consists of 5 goals: Work towards making South Pasadena a Plastic-Free City, Enhance Water Conservation Projects and Programs, Increase Organics Diversion from Landfill, Mitigate Impacts of the Urban Heat Island Effect, and Prepare for the

Consideration of Future Sustainability Initiatives. He gave a detailed update on each goal and shared the progress that has been made for each "Move".

Commissioners periodically asked questions and provided suggestions throughout the presentation. Commissioner Bortz asked about Greywater System rebates that may be in place for the City. Commissioner Jones raised the question about permits with greywater systems and how to encourage residents to utilize this technology. Commissioner Siegel asked how successful the water conservation rebates have been in the City. Chair Law asked how often City law is revisited to comply with State mandate.

ACTION ITEMS:

3) Appoint NREC Member for Recreation Lease Ad Hoc Committee

MOTION BY COMMISSIONER JONES, SECOND BY COMMISSIONER TOM, MOTION CARRIED 6-0, TO APPOINT COMMISSIONER MICHAEL SIEGEL AS THE RECREATION LEASE AD HOC COMMITTEE MEMBER.

4) Approval of Minutes – Special Meeting of December 5, 2022

MOTION BY COMMISSIONER HUSHAGEN, SECOND BY COMMISSIONER SIEGEL, MOTION CARRIED 6-0, TO DENY THE APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES FROM THE DECEMBER 5, 2022 NREC COMMISSION SPECIAL MEETING. THE MOTION UNDER ITEM 2: CONTINUED TREE HEARING-1865 HANSCOM DRIVE WILL BE REVISED AND REVIEWED DURING THE FEBRUARY COMISSION MEETING.

COMMUNICATIONS:

5) City Council Liaison Communications

Councilmember Cacciotti discussed the Gold Line Project. He spoke about the ban on gas-powered leaf blowers and thanked City Staff for their efforts with outreach. He briefly spoke of AB2766, an Assembly Bill set in place that is meant to reduce mobile source emissions.

6) Commissioner Communications

Commissioner Siegel congratulated Councilmember Cacciotti for becoming Vice Chair of the SCAQMD Governing Board. He also shared that a recent report published by the EPA disclosed that Particulate Matter (PM) is dangerous to human health. Commissioner Siegel then proposed City Staff to consider including active transportation efforts in the City's Climate Action Plan's transportation section.

Chair Law shared State climate goals, as proposed by the California Air Resources Board (CARB), during the Mobility and Transportation Infrastructure Commission Meeting (MTIC). Chair Law also encouraged Commissioners to continue using alternative forms of transportation walking, biking, or using transit to attend NREC meetings.

7) Staff Liaison Communications

Ted Gerber, Public Works Director, discussed the feasibility of a "community toolbox" program suggestion and avenues the City can explore. When the Climate Action Plan (CAP) is revisited, active transportation will be considered. He shared updates from the Mobility and Transportation Infrastructure Commission (MTIC) Meeting.

Melanis Stepanian, Water Conservation and Sustainability Intern, shared the upcoming Electric Leaf Blower Demonstration event with the Commission. She discussed that Earth Day is approaching and encouraged Commission Members and residents to brainstorm ideas for events.

COMPOST

Compost (donated by *Athens Services*) is a mixture of decayed organic material, including food waste, and is used for enriching soil. Athens compost is certified organic under the USDA National Organic Program.

Mulch (donated by *West Coast Arborist*) is chipped tree trimmings or bark groundcover. It works as an insulator, maintaining the temperature of soil and roots to reduce evaporation and the formation of weeds.

- Bring a sturdy container and shovel
- Limit 2 (two) 35 gallon containers per household
- Bring proof of residence (ID or utility bill)
