	Plan (<i>i.e.</i> , integrating the requirements for public art with the City's electronic permitting system to help keep track of the pipeline to ensure timely assessment of potential fees and better communication with applicants and art donations), and an update on the policy handbook. Items to include in the 2023-2024 Work Plan are: production of a roster of local artists; creation of a catalogue of existing public art in the City; building a master list of potential public sites for public art installations for City Council consideration; and finalizing and presenting the City's Public Art Program Handbook to City Council for approval. The Commissioners agreed this would be a great resource for developers and supported the suggested Work Plan, including a suggestion to include historical artists on the roster of local artists, to be sponsored by Commissioner Piazza. The Commissioners were enthusiastic about the 2023- 2024 Work Plan and expressed their approval.
