18. <u>Public Hearing to Receive Objections or Protests to the Vegetation Management</u> <u>Program Regarding the Abatement of Weeds, Brush, Rubbish and Refuse Upon or in</u> <u>Front of Specified Property in the City and Authorizing by Minute Order the Abatement</u> <u>of Hazardous Vegetation</u>

Fire Chief Paul Riddle provided a staff report and responded to City Council inquiries.

Mayor Khubesrian opened the public hearing.

There being no one desiring to speak on this item, Mayor Khubesrian closed the public hearing.

MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER CACCIOTTI SECOND BY COUNCILMEMBER SCHNEIDER, CARRIED 5-0, to hold a Public Hearing and receive public testimony and hear any objections or protests to the procedures for abating brush and native vegetation fire hazards identified in Resolution No. 7596, and adopt by motion an order directing the abatement of hazardous vegetation.

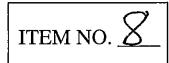

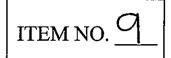

Recommendation Action

It is recommended that the City Council:

- 1. Accept the War Memorial Building Improvements (Project) as complete;
- 2. Authorize the recordation of the Notice of Completion (NOC) with the Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder County Clerk; and
- 3. Authorize release of retention payment to Golden Sun Firm & Co., Inc., (Contractor), in the amount of \$10,835.10.

Commission Review and Recommendation

This matter was not reviewed a commission.

Discussion/Analysis

The improvements to the War Memorial Building have been completed for a total contract amount of \$216,702. This total contract amount includes a change order in the amount of \$51,925 to resolve various issues that arose during the course of construction. The excavation work for the waterproofing and installation of the drainage system revealed several unforeseen circumstances that led to scope changes. The largest change dealt with the need to build a new subsurface exterior wall due to the discovery of a brick exterior support wall. In addition, the subsurface work revealed that the existing foundation footings had been over-poured, which resulted in the requirement for additional and unforeseen substantial preparatory work in order to complete the waterproofing work.

A list of both the interior and exterior change order items are as follows:

- Wall repair for excessive mold remediation, including patch repairs on the south and west walls
- Painting of the north, south and west walls
- Painting of the ceiling beams

- Installation and removal of a temporary access ramp
- Wall cleaning and hand removal of dirt to expose the brick and other uneven surfaces
- Wall repair and mortar patch work to level out the wall in preparation for the installation of the waterproofing system

A payment has been made to Golden Sun Firm & Co., Inc. in the amount of \$205,866.90, with \$10,835.10 held in retention. There are sufficient funds in the War Memorial Building Waterproofing/Rehab Account for the Project. The Project was inspected and managed by inhouse staff.

Background

The War Memorial Building was built in 1921 and is identified as a City Cultural Heritage landmark. The main floor of the building includes a kitchen and a large multi-purpose room for dancing, meetings and banquets. The underground floor consists of smaller rooms, storage, and restroom facilities. The building was not fully utilized due to some issues with a lower level wall that has cracks, high moisture content, or seepage especially during rains. The water intrusion is due to seepage coming from the exterior of the building.

The War Memorial Building Improvements project consisted of removal and replacement of concrete sidewalk, trenching and installation of a moisture protection barrier and drainage system, and abatement and remediation of mold, asbestos and lead from the basement area. All of the renovation work for this project was designed in accordance with the requirements of the National Parks Service and local Historic Preservation guidelines.

Legal Review

The City Attorney has reviewed this item.

Fiscal Impact

This project was funded from the War Memorial Building Waterproofing/Rehab Account No. 105-9000-9258-9258

Environmental Analysis

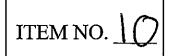

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Council:

- Accept a bid and alternate bid dated January 31, 2019, from CT&T Concrete Paving, Inc. for the construction of the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Fiscal Year (FY) 2018-19 Sidewalk Replacement and ADA Access Ramps Project (Project) at various locations and authorize the City Manager to enter into a contract with CT&T Concrete Paving, Inc. (Contractor) for a not-to-exceed amount of \$137,800.
- 2. Reject all other bids received.

Commission Review and Recommendation

This matter was not reviewed by a Commission.

Discussion/Analysis

On January 11, 2019, the Project was advertised for bids. In compliance with the Public Contract Code, the Project was advertised in the South Pasadena Review newspaper and also in various construction publications including F.W. Dodge, Daily Construction Service, Bid Net, and Contractors Information Network.

On January 31, 2019, the City Clerk's Division received and opened seven (7) bids with the result as follows:

Staff has reviewed the Contractor's references, and their work was verified to be of good quality. The Contractor has satisfactorily completed similar projects for other agencies, such as the Cities of Cypress, Downey and Chino. The Contractor's license has been verified to be currently valid and in good standing. Staff's recommendation is to award the Project to CT&T Concrete Paving, Inc. Upon award of the Project, construction is anticipated to begin in March 2019 and completed by May 2019.

Background

The Project consists of reconstructing approximately 14,100 square feet of localized sidewalk on Olive Ave (Pine St. to Huntington Dr.), Santa Teresa (Camino Del Sol to Cul-De-Sac), Los Laureles (Santa Teresa to Cul-De-Sac), Meridian Ave. (Grevelia St. to Oliver St.), Oliver St. (Meridian Ave. to Beacon Ave.), Beacon Ave. (Oliver St. to Cul-De-Sac), La Senda Pl. (Huntington Dr. to Garfield Ave.) and 9 ADA access ramps repairs at various locations as indicated on the Project Location Map. The sidewalk repair locations are selected based on City of South Pasadena's (City) Sidewalk Inspection Report in combination with high pedestrian areas, and the access ramp installations are selected based on service requests received from property owners reporting access barriers, along with path of travel analysis in high activity areas. The Project would enhance pedestrian mobility, walkability, and would reduce the City's exposure to future trip and fall claims. On January 9, 2019, the Los Angeles County Community Development Commission (CDC) reviewed and approved the Project plan and specification documents in compliance with CDBG funding guidelines.

Legal Review

The City Attorney has reviewed this item.

Fiscal Impact

There are sufficient funds available in the FY 2018-19 Budget for the construction of this Project. The Project will be funded from the CDBG Account No. 260-9000-9264-9264 in the amount of \$123,021.00 and from the Sidewalk, Curb & Gutter Account No. 104-9000-9287-9287 in the amount of \$14,779.00.

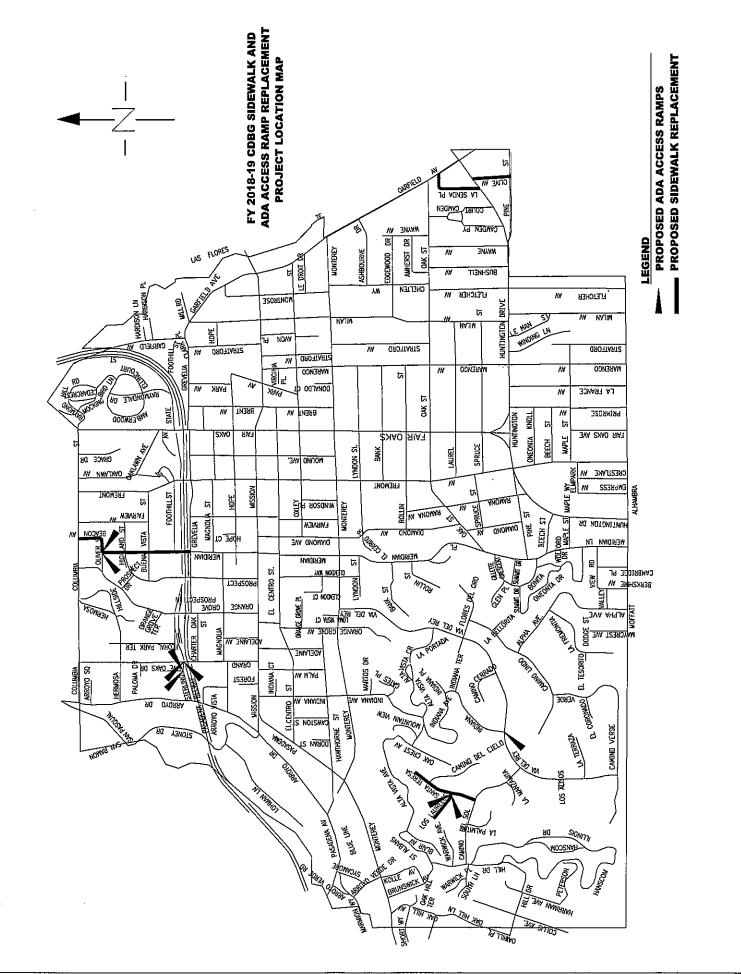

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CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT / AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 6^{th} day of <u>March 2019</u>, by and between CITY OF SOUTH PASADENA, a municipal corporation of the State of California, hereinafter referred to as "CITY" and <u>CT&T Concrete Paving, Inc.</u>, "CONTRACTOR."

That the CITY and the CONTRACTOR, for the consideration hereinafter named, mutually agree as follows:

1. Contract Documents. The complete contract and agreement ("AGREEMENT") consists of the Contract Documents, which includes all of the following documents incorporated herein by this reference: Approved Contract Documents Specifications (CDBG Project No. 601988-18), Notice Inviting Bids, Instructions to Bidders, Information for Bidders, Contractor's Bid Proposal, this Contract/Agreement, Standard Specifications, Special Provisions, Reference Specifications and amendments thereto. In the event of conflict between these documents, precedence shall be determined under section 2-5.2 of the Standard Specifications.

2. Scope of Services. CONTRACTOR shall perform everything required to be performed, shall provide and furnish all the labor, materials, necessary tools, expendable equipment, and all utility and transportation services required for the following work of improvement: FY 2018-19 Sidewalk Replacement and ADA Access Ramps Project all in accordance with the Contract Documents and Contractor's Proposal dated January 31, 2019.

CONTRACTOR agrees to perform all the work and furnish all the materials at his own cost and expense necessary to construct and complete in a good and workman-like manner and to the satisfaction of the City Engineer of the CITY, the Work of Improvement in accordance with the plans, specifications, and Contract Documents (the "Specifications") therefore prepared by City's Engineering Department and adopted by the City Council.

3. Compensation. CITY agrees to pay and CONTRACTOR agrees to accept in full payment for this Work of Improvement the stipulated sum of <u>One Hundred Thirty Seven</u> <u>Thousand Eight Hundred (\$137,800)</u> subject to staff satisfactory completion and acceptance by the City.

CITY agrees to make monthly payments and final payment in accordance with the method set forth in the Specifications.

4. Time for Completion. CONTRACTOR agrees to commence construction of the Work of Improvement within fifteen (15) days after issuance of a Notice To Proceed, and to continue in a diligent and workman-like manner without interruption, and to complete the construction thereof within Forty Five (45) calendar days from the date the Notice to Proceed is issued.

5. Time is of the Essence. Time is of essence of this Contract, and it is agreed that it would be impracticable or extremely difficult to ascertain the extent of actual loss or damage which the CITY will sustain by reason of any delay in the performance of this Agreement. It is, therefore, agreed that CONTRACTOR will pay as liquidated damages to the CITY the following Approved for Use 11.15.16 164418.3

sum: Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each day's delay beyond the time herein prescribed for finishing work. If liquidated damages are not paid, as designated by the CITY, the CITY may deduct the amount thereof from any money due or that may become due the CONTRACTOR under this Agreement in addition to any other remedy available to CITY. The CONTRACTOR shall not be assessed liquidated damages for any delay caused by the failure of a public utility to relocate or remove an existing utility required for the performance of this Contract.

6. Prevailing Wages Required. The CONTRACTOR will pay, and will require all subcontractors to pay, all employees on the work of improvement a salary or wage at least equal to the prevailing salary or wage established for such work as set forth in the wage determinations for this work. Travel and subsistence pay shall be paid in accordance with Labor Code Section 1773.8. The CONTRACTOR shall forfeit to the CITY, as penalty, \$200.00 for each calendar day or portion thereof for each worker paid (either by him or any subcontractors under him) less than the prevailing rate described above on the work provided for in this Agreement, all in accordance with Section 1775 of the Labor Code of the State of California.

7. 8-Hour Day. In the performance of this Contract, not more than eight (8) hours shall constitute a day's work, and the CONTRACTOR shall not require more than eight (8) hours in a day from any person employed by him hereunder, except as provided in the Labor Code of the State of California. The CONTRACTOR shall adhere to Article 3, Chapter 1, Part 7 (Sections 1810, et seq.) of the Labor Code of the State of California, and it is agreed that the CONTRACTOR shall forfeit to the CITY as a penalty the sum of \$200.00 for each worker employed in the execution of this Contract by the CONTRACTOR or any subcontractor for each calendar day during which any worker is required or permitted to labor more than eight (8) hours in violation of that article.

8. Workers Compensation. CONTRACTOR, by executing this Agreement hereby certifies:

"I am aware of the provisions of Section 3700 of the Labor Code which requires every employer to be insured against liability for Worker's Compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of that Code, and I will comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the work of this Contract."

9. Bonds. CONTRACTOR shall, prior to the execution of this Contract, furnish two bonds approved by the CITY, one in the amount of One Hundred Percent (100%) of the Contract price, to guarantee the faithful performance of the work, and one in the amount of One Hundred Percent (100%) of the Contract price to guarantee payment of all claims for labor and materials furnished. This Contract shall not become effective until such bonds are supplied to and approved by the CITY. CONTRACTOR shall, prior to the release of the performance and payment bonds or the retention payment, furnish a warranty performance and payment bond equal to at least ten percent of the final contract price or \$1,000, whichever is greater.

10. Arbitration. This AGREEMENT is further subject to the provisions of Article 1.5 (commencing at Section 20104) of Division 2, Part 3 of the Public Contract Code regarding the resolution of public works claims of less than \$375,000. Article 1.5 mandates certain procedures for the filing of claims and supporting documentation by Contractor, for the response to such claims by the Agency, for a mandatory meet and confer conference upon the request of Contractor, for mandatory nonbinding mediation in the event litigation is commenced, and for

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mandatory judicial arbitration upon the parties' failure to resolve the dispute through mediation. This AGREEMENT hereby incorporates the provisions of Article 1.5 as though fully set forth herein.

11. Prompt Payment. This Agreement is subject to the provisions of Article 1.7 (commencing at Section 20104.50) of Division 2, Part 3 of the Public Contract Code regarding prompt payment of contractors by local governments. Article 1.7 mandates certain procedures for the payment of undisputed and properly submitted payment requests within 30 days after receipt, for the review of payment requests, for notice to Contractor of improper payment requests, and provides for the payment of interest on progress payment requests which are not timely made in accordance with that Article. This AGREEMENT hereby incorporates the provisions of Article 1.7 as though fully set forth herein.

12. Securities for Retentions. At the request and expense of CONTRACTOR, securities equivalent to the amount withheld shall be deposited with AGENCY, or with a state or federally chartered bank in this state as the escrow agent, who shall then pay those moneys to CONTRACTOR upon Agency's confirmation of CONTRACTOR'S satisfactory completion of this AGREEMENT. At any time during the term of this AGREEMENT CONTRACTOR may, at its own expense, substitute securities for funds otherwise withheld as retention (or the retained percentage) in accordance with Public Contract Code § 22300.

13. Registration with DIR. Pursuant to Labor Code § 1725.5, CONTRACTOR and any subcontractor must be registered with the California Department of Industrial Relations for any bid proposal and prior to performing any work. Further, this project is subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement by the Department of Industrial Relations.

14. Subcontractor Eligibility. This AGREEMENT is subject to Public Contract Code Section 6109: CONTRACTOR shall be prohibited from performing work on this project with a subcontractor who is ineligible to perform work on the project pursuant to Sections 1777.1 or 1777.7 of the Labor Code.

15. Apprentices. CONTRACTOR shall comply with the provisions of Labor Code Section 1777.5 concerning the employment of apprentices on public works projects, and further agrees that CONTRACTOR is responsible for compliance with Section 1777.5 by all of its subcontractors.

16. Records. CONTRACTOR shall maintain any and all ledgers, books of account, invoices, vouchers, canceled checks, and other records or documents evidencing or relating to charges for services or expenditures and disbursements charged to CITY under this Agreement for a minimum of three (3) years, or for any longer period required by law, from the date of final payment to CONTRACTOR under this Agreement. All such documents shall be made available for inspection, audit, and/or copying at any time during regular business hours, upon oral or written request of CITY. In addition, pursuant to Government Code Section 8546.7, all such documents and this Agreement shall be subject to the examination and audit of the State Auditor, at the request of CITY or as part of any audit of CITY, for a period of three (3) years after final payment under the Agreement.

17. Indemnity. To the fullest extent permitted by law, CONTRACTOR shall, at its sole cost and expense, fully defend, indemnify and hold harmless CITY, its authorized representatives and their respective subsidiaries, affiliates, members, directors, officers, employees and agents (collectively, the "Indemnitees") from and against any and all claims, actions, demands, costs, judgments, liens, penalties, liabilities, damages, losses, and expenses, including but not limited to any fees of accountants, attorneys or other professionals (collectively "Liabilities"), arising out of, in connection with, resulting from or related to, any alleged act, omission, fault or negligence of CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR's Representative, or any of its officers, agents, employees, Subcontractors or Suppliers, or any person or organization directly or indirectly employed by any of them (Collectively, the "Indemnitors"), in connection with or relating to or claimed to be in connection with or relating to the work performed under this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR shall not be entitled to any refund of attorneys' fees, defense costs and expenses in the event that it is s adjudicated to have been non-negligent.

CONTRACTOR shall not be required to defend or indemnify CITY for liabilities caused by the sole active negligence or willful misconduct of CITY.

If CONTRACTOR is a joint venture or partnership, each venturer or partner shall be jointly and severally liable for any and all of the duties and obligations of CONTRACTOR that are assumed under or arise out of this AGREEMENT. Each of such venturers or partners waives notice of the breach or non-performance of any undertaking or obligation of CONTRACTOR contained in, resulting from or assumed under this AGREEMENT, and the failure to give any such notice shall not affect or impair such venturer's or partner's joint and several liability hereunder.

18. Attorneys' Fees Following Disputes. In the event of a dispute between the parties under this AGREEMENT, the prevailing party is not entitled to attorneys' fees from the other party. This provision takes precedence over any conflicting provision in any of the documents which are incorporated herein by reference.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Council grant the appeal of a decision of the Natural Resources and Environmental Commission (NREC) for the removal of two non-native trees at 1921 Illinois Drive.

Commission Review and Recommendation

This matter was reviewed by the NREC on January 22, 2019 which denied the removal of the subject trees. The applicant is appealing this denial.

Background

On November 6, 2018, the applicant submitted a Private Property Tree Removal application to remove two non-native Pine trees. The City Arborist inspected the trees and provided an assessment that both trees were healthy. On December 7, 2018, the public notice was mailed to neighbors and the City received no letters of opposition, however, since the trees were healthy, staff sought NREC's review and recommendation.

Discussion/Analysis

According to the South Pasadena Municipal Code (SPMC) Section 34.8, applicants can appeal decisions of the NREC to the City Council. On February 3, 2019, the applicants submitted an appeal (Attachment 1) to the City Council based on the recommendation from the NREC to deny the removal of two non-native pine trees. According to the applicant, they should be allowed to remove the trees based on the following reasons:

1). The pine trees are 40' in height and drop a significant amount of pine needles into the gutters and to the frontage of the property, which may cause a safety issue due to the steep slope of the driveway. The gutters are not accessible by ladder due to the height of the property and slope of the driveway.

• SPMC Section 34.7(a)(1) Where the tree itself, its excess foliage or its limbs poses a reasonable risk of injury or harm to any persons or property, or is interfering with a

structure or building, and there is no feasible and reasonable alternative to mitigate the interference.

2). Due to the height of the property and the gutters at approximately 40' from the ground the owners have two options of maintaining gutters and pruning of the trees. The applicants would have to rent equipment costing upwards of \$3,400 in order to maintain their property and other required permits to have the equipment on the street.

• SPMC 34.7(a)(2)Where, upon taking into account the size, shape, topography and existing trees upon the lot, the denial of the permit would create an unreasonable hardship on the property owner.

3. If the City Council approves the removal of the trees, the applicants are required to plant four replacement trees (Desert Museum Palo Verde, Western Redbud, or California Bay Laurel), which are native drought tolerant trees that will conserve water and provide a greater benefit to the City.

• SPMC 34.7(a)(4) For the removal of significant or mature trees, where the proposed replacement tree planting provides greater benefits than the existing tree's value, benefits or species.

The City respectfully disagrees with NREC's decision and recommends the Council grant the appeal. The maintenance of the subject trees would cause undue physical and financial hardship. Further, the four replacement trees would bring a greater benefit to the City because they would provide a better canopy, are native to the region, and are drought tolerant, which is in line with community priorities.

Legal Review

The City Attorney has reviewed this item.

Fiscal Impact

The applicant has paid the initial tree removal inspection fee and if the City Council approves the removal of the subject trees; the applicant will pay the permit fee of \$121.50.

Environmental Analysis

This item is exempt from any California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) analysis.

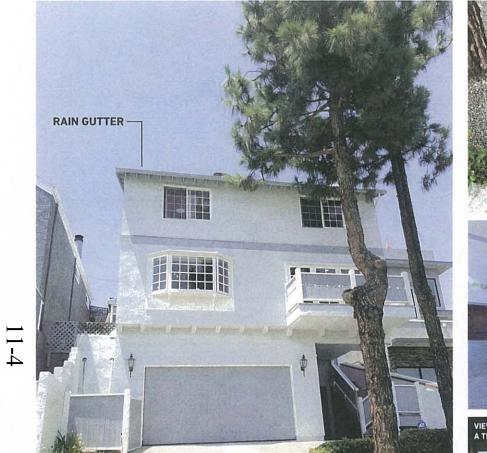

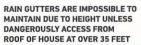

We are writing to appeal the recent decision of the Natural Resources and Environmental Commission to deny a permit for the removal of two unprotected Canary Pine trees that are located on our property. We presented the following facts during the hearing on January 22, 2019 and we were confident the commissioners would uphold the code and we would be able to reasonably proceed with the process.

In accordance with Chapter 34.7 of the city code:

1. There is no feasible and reasonable way to mitigate the interference of the trees with our home:

Where the tree itself, its excess foliage or its limbs poses a reasonable risk of injury or harm to any persons or property, or is interfering with a structure or building, and there is no feasible and reasonable alternative to mitigate the interference.

These trees tower 40' in height and are growing into our home. In addition they drop significant amounts of pine needles into our gutters and steep, slippery driveway year round. These gutters are not accessible by ladder or by climbing onto the roof due to the excessive height of the home and steep slope of the driveway.

2. The denial of the permit will create an unreasonable hardship

Where, upon taking into account the size, shape, topography and existing trees upon the lot, the denial of the permit would create an unreasonable hardship on the property owner.

Where most homeowners can use a ladder, which is a reasonable solution to maintain their property, we do not have this option. Believe it or not, my husband and I pride in a well kept home both on the exterior and interior. Furthermore, my husband was recently diagnosed with Mild Arthritis on his right arm which would limit his capability of sweeping regularly. We would be able to provide a Doctor's note if needed. Given that the gutter is approximately 40' from the ground, we have two safe options for maintaining the gutters and the pruning of the trees:

- a) Rent scaffolding to clean the gutters and prune the tree. We received a quote for \$3,400 dollars to do this. This would also pose a risk being that high up in the air even with scaffolding. Something that we wouldn't feel comfortable with for safety reasons.
- b) Rent a 40' boom lift and obtain a city street closure permit to prune the trees and maintain the gutters on a regular maintenance schedule.

These options are not reasonable and represent a financial hardship to us as property owners. With a new mortgage and nearly \$15,000 per year in property tax, these options represent a financial hardship that we simply cannot absorb.

3. The proposed drought resistant replacement trees will provide a greater benefit that the existing trees value.

For the removal of significant or mature trees, where the proposed replacement tree planting provides greater benefits than the existing tree's value, benefits or species.

We are prepared to replace these unprotected Canary Pine Trees with native and drought tolerant trees under the list of Approved Trees by City of South Pasadena. This not only allows the city to conserve water on this planet, it will help propagate the approved tree plan for the city.

During our presentation to the NERC on January 22rd, the commissioners' board brought up the following three points, all of which we were not given an opportunity to contest:

- 1. Purchase a Rain Gutter Screen.
 - a. Even with a rain gutter screen we will still be required to maintain the trees and gutters in an unreasonable method that will propose a financial hardship. A gutter screen would only postpone such maintenance.
- 2. The trees provide shade for the home and reduce the energy consumption.
 - a. While the trees may provide some shade, which reduces the energy consumption, energy is a renewable resource. The proposed replacement trees are drought tolerant, this means we will be conserving water, which is a greater benefit to the City as water is not a renewable resource. In the long term, we are considering installing solar panels that would create energy back to the grid. As you are well aware, the City of South Pasadena prides in the conservation of water as residents, the water basic charge on top of water conservation charges and efficiency fees.
- 3. Maintaining the trees is not a hardship
 - a. This is simply not the case; maintaining these trees IS a financial hardship for our family. We simply do not have the means to pay exorbitant amounts of money annually for maintenance of two trees.

The proposed points do not give due cause for the city to deny our permit. We respectfully request that the appeal is granted and the code is upheld. Sincerely,

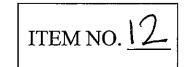

SUBJECT:	Review of Five-Year Financial Forecast and Initiation of Community Engagement Regarding Long-Range Financial Sustainability Plan

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Council review the Five-Year Financial Forecast and direct staff to proceed with gathering feedback from the community regarding strategies for a long-range financial sustainability plan.

Commission Review and Recommendation

This matter will be presented to the Finance Commission for comment at City Council's direction.

Executive Summary

Although the City overcame the potential loss of General Fund revenues from the Utility Users Tax (UUT), the City now faces additional financial challenges, prompting the need for a long-range financial sustainability plan. As with all cities in California, South Pasadena is burdened by increasing pension costs from CalPERS (the state pension fund), as well as increasing costs across the board for materials, contractors, and personnel. In addition, the City has aging infrastructure that will require significant additional investment in future years. The five-year forecast demonstrates that City revenues are not projected to keep pace with these rising costs. Further, the UUT will sunset in 2022 if not renewed by voters in 2020. The loss of this \$3.4 million would dangerously escalate the severity of the City's financial position.

South Pasadena has a variety of options available to balance future budgets including, increasing revenue through economic, administrative, and other non-tax alternatives; increasing revenue by restructuring local taxes; and reducing costs through the reduction of personnel and the services they provide. Staff is recommending that the Council direct staff to engage the community in review and discussion of available alternatives to create a framework for the development of a long-range financial sustainability plan. Through this process, the City can be strategic in developing financial structures to maintain the high quality of life currently offered by the City, while also creating stability in the face of future challenges.

Background

The City has a General Fund budget of approximately \$27 million annually. The largest source of revenue to the General Fund is property taxes, at 51%. The UUT contributes 12% and sales taxes make up 11%. User fees and charges are only 9% of the General Fund, with smaller miscellaneous sources making up the rest. The General Fund budget is supplemented by local return funds such as transit dollars, special taxes such as the Library Tax, and grant funds.

Because the City is a provider of services, as opposed to manufactured goods, human resources are the City's largest asset and largest expense. A majority of the City budget, 72%, is expended on personnel line items including salaries, health benefits, and retirement plans. This number increases when factoring in additional funds spent on contract staff who are not counted as personnel expenses, but contribute to the City team. Together these staff enable the City to provide a full suite of services, including our own police, fire and water departments, and manage the infrastructure to create and sustain an unusually high quality of life for a small city.

By department, or service, the majority of funds, 51%, are expended on the staffing and operations of the Police and Fire Departments. The second largest service expenditure is the Public Works Department and repairs to critical infrastructure. The Library and Community Services Departments are also large portions of the budget, but they are heavily subsidized by local return funds and special taxes, rather than General Fund dollars.

The City has always had a balanced budget in years past with revenues exceeding expenditures. However, the five-year forecast shows expenditures exceeding revenues each year beginning next year.

CalPERS Pension Costs

The single largest challenge to the City's budget is the imposition of mandatory new payments to CalPERS. As a result of a number of factors, the CalPERS investment fund is significantly underfunded. In the early 1990s, it was "super-funded," meaning the balance was more than 100% of the value necessary to meet obligations. Today, although the fund balance has increased in recent years, it remains below 70%. Investment experts disagree, but believe it should be funded between 80 and 100%.

CalPERS' investments suffered greatly from the economic recession that began in 2008, when the system suffered a gross impact of nearly 35% loss to its investment funds. As a result, CalPERS has become much more conservative in its estimates of return. Further, CalPERS has shifted policies to account for longer lifespans among retirees and made a significant change in the ratio of working/contributing members to the number of retired/receiving members. While there were two working members for every retired member in 1990, there are now two retired members for less than one working member today. These are just a few of the factors that impact the financial positon of CalPERS.

In response to the unstable fund balance, CalPERS has revised a number of assumptions in their pro forma and adjusted their future outlook on earnings to align with the current economic realities. With limited options to generate additional revenue, CalPERS also revised the rates it

charges to municipal member agencies, and significantly increased costs to cities across the State, almost all of whom are struggling to comply with the new demands.

Clearly CalPERS has a structural sustainability issue, as has been found in pension plans across the country. Solutions can be found at the State level in the form of legislative and legal actions. The California Legislature took a significant step to lower future pension costs with the California Public Employees' Pension Reform Act (PEPRA), which took effect in January 2013. The legislation changes the way CalPERS retirement and health benefits are applied and places compensation limits on retirees. Further, retirement formulas are reduced and the retirement age increased for all employees hired after its enactment. A new defined benefit formula is imposed at 2% at 62 for all new miscellaneous members and a maximum benefit factor of 2.5% at age 67. In comparison, most cities today pay 2.5% at 55 and higher for public safety personnel. While these are significant and meaningful changes, the effects will not be felt by cities until the generation who was hired in 2013 or thereafter begins to retire, in roughly 20-30 years.

Other attempts to manage pension costs include pending legal challenges against what is known as "The California Rule," a law that currently prevents cities from reducing the amount of benefits to contracted employees without replacing them with something of equal value. Within the constraint of this law, South Pasadena and other cities may not reduce the amount of pension benefits once they have been established by employment contract. If the rule is overturned by the California Supreme Court, cities may have options in the future, however, it is anticipated that legal challenges to a Court decision could delay implementation by a decade or more.

The bottom line is that CalPERS investment funds have fallen to an alarming level and must be stabilized. While this has potentially devastating impacts on local governments, cities have no control over the management of the CalPERS investment funds or the rates that are subsequently charged to member agencies to support the fund. Further, cities have no legal path to reduce the provision of benefits to employees contracted under the pre-PEPRA rules.

It has been suggested that cities should simply exit CalPERS in favor of a 401(k)-type plan for employees, similar to those offered by the private sector. Exiting CalPERS would require each city to prepay all contractual future pension obligations. This is similar to requiring full payment of a mortgage balance all at once, instead of making monthly payments. By law, all obligations must be met and cannot be abandoned. Agencies that have explored this process have found the exit payment to be infeasible, often many times the cost of the entire annual budget. There are further legal complications associated with an exit, however staff has not explored those as the exit payment makes this alternative infeasible for South Pasadena.

City Personnel Costs

Cities can manage their cost of PERS in two primary ways – rate of pay and retirement formula. Because the city must pay a percentage of the employee's salary to PERS, the more an employee makes in salary, the higher the city's payment. South Pasadena has been extremely conservative in establishing pay rates for employees and currently pays among the lowest salaries in the San Gabriel Valley. While this is an effective tool for keeping PERS payments low, it is detrimental to recruiting and retaining high quality staff. The City frequently loses staff to higher paying Discuss the City of South Pasadena Long Range Financial Plan March 6, 2019 Page 4 of 6

cities. And, in a competitive job market, it is difficult for the City to fill vacant positions, particularly when this factor is combined with the fact that the City also pays a lower pension formula as described below. Despite the challenges with CalPERS costs, the City will need to invest in human resources to be able to keep staff positions filled and maintain City services at current levels.

CalPERS offers four retirement formulas: 2.0%, 2.5%, 2.7% and 3.0% for non-public safety employees, with higher rates offered for public safety personnel. The most common retirement formula is the 2.5% at 55 plan. South Pasadena pays 2.0%, the lowest possible option, to its non-PEPRA miscellaneous employees. This was a prudent decision and has kept pension obligations in check, however it does contribute to challenges in attracting employees.

The City can also control its pension liability by simply controlling the number of employees. While it is common for government agencies to see a gradual creep in the number and scope programs, and subsequently in the number of full-time positions, South Pasadena has remained conservative in this area as well. In the last five years, the city has increased the number of full-time staff by only three positions. Those were not the result of an expansion of service or programs; rather they were the conversion of contract employees to regular full-time employees. South Pasadena has roughly .5 employees per 1,000 residents. In comparison, cities with larger budgets, such as Pasadena, have 1.3 employees per thousand residents, or more than twice the ratio of South Pasadena. The scope and scale of South Pasadena's government has remained focused and efficient within the available budget.

In summary, as a result of conservative fiscal management, South Pasadena's pension burden is modest compared to many other cities. According the California Policy Center, South Pasadena's burden ranks 242 out of 459 cities. Cities facing the largest threats, some in the San Gabriel Valley, allocate over 12% of their total revenue toward pension contributions. In comparison, South Pasadena allocates approximately 5% of total revenue. These percentages are anticipated to increase for all cities however, reaching crisis proportions for those hardest hit.

Despite these factors, the City is still facing a financial shortfall over the next five years and must be strategic in building a sustainable long-range financial plan.

City Infrastructure

South Pasadena was founded in 1888 and much of the City infrastructure dates back to the early 20th Century. For many decades, the City did not make the necessary investments to adequately maintain and repair its aging infrastructure and buildings. In addition, the City owns facilities that are historic properties, requiring complex and costly annual maintenance. A lack of timely repair ultimately adds significant higher expenses to most projects.

In 2012, the City Council made a commitment to address deferred maintenance, starting with street and roadway repair projects. The City has also made substantial investments in its aging water infrastructure. Since 2015, the City has taken steps to replace and upgrade three reservoirs built in the early 1900s: Wilson Reservoir was replaced in 2015; Garfield Reservoir was replaced

in 2018; and Graves Reservoir is now being rebuilt after a collapsed roof had rendered it inoperable for several years.

Last year, the Council adopted the City's first Capital Improvement Plan (CIP), a five-year strategy that identified more than \$100 million in critical projects. This is the first time the City has had a comprehensive inventory of capital needs. These projects include larger systems such as roadways and water infrastructure, which are critical to maintaining quality of life, as well as smaller projects such as upgrading electrical systems, plumbing, and drainage mitigation. Less than half of the projects identified in the CIP are funded.

The City must also prepare for unforeseen expenses. Two recent examples include the unexpected War Memorial drainage project and mitigation of the new 1,2,3-TCP water regulations. Both required considerable funds from the City to maintain quality of service for residents.

It is critical that the City plan for the costs of anticipated infrastructure and building maintenance, along unforeseen expenses, within long-term budget strategies. A long-range financial plan will serve as an important tool to ensure the City's future sustainability and resiliency.

Discussion

With no options to control the rates charged by PERS and no current options to reduce the amount of pension benefits provided to employees, the City has several other options to balance the budget, including:

- Cutting costs by:
 - Reducing services and associated personnel such as reducing service hours or eliminating programs;
- Increasing revenue by:
 - Encouraging investment in business districts that generate property and sales taxes;
 - o Establishing new fees such as parking meters;
 - Increasing existing City fees for service;
 - Restructuring local taxes;
 - o Allowing new land uses and associated taxes such as a cannabis tax or a hotel tax;
 - o Redeveloping city properties in a manner that generates more revenue.

Staff recommends a robust community engagement program to review all potential options, identify preferred alternatives, and inform future strategies. A financial model will be presented to the community establishing the baseline gap for each year and outlining the potential budget impact of a variety of budget cuts and revenue enhancements, allowing residents to test a variety of options and scenarios. The model is still being finalized at the time of writing, but will be presented to the City Council along with this report at the March 6th City Council Meeting.

Through the community engagement process, staff anticipates gaining perspective on those options, or combination of options, that receive the greatest support from the community. That feedback will then be used to guide the development of a Long-range Financial Sustainability Plan to be presented to Council as part of the annual budget in June.

The community engagement plan was presented to and approved by City Council on February 20th. It includes community forums, presentations to a variety of community groups, an online engagement tool, and extensive electronic and social media outreach.

Next Steps

- 1. Staff and officials will present the financial model to the community throughout the month of March;
- 2. Framed by community feedback, staff will prepare a recommended financial plan for adoption by the City Council in June;
- 3. Staff will monitor the plan to ensure goals are being met and will update the plan as part of the budget process each year.

Legal Review

The City Attorney has reviewed this item.

Fiscal Impact

The development of a long-range financial sustainability plan is critical to ensure the continued provision of high quality services and to ensure the resiliency of the City in the face of future challenges. Costs for community engagement are factored into the current annual budget.

Environmental Analysis

This item is exempt from any California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).
