Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Council:

- 4. Authorize a construction contingency of approximately ten percent in the amount of \$20,470 for a total amount of \$225,250.

Executive Summary

On November 6, 2019, the City Council directed staff to: 1) Evaluate the possibility of replacing the current City custom design bike hitches (consistent with those located at City Hall, city parks, and the Arroyo Seco Bike and Pedestrian trail) with the inverted "U-rack" type bike parking; 2) Research "off-the-shelf" alternatives that may be less expensive; and 3) Provide photos of the proposed bike parking locations.

In response, staff contacted four vendors and none of them maintained an "off-the-shelf" bike rack inventory. All vendors quoted a minimum lead time of six to eight weeks to manufacture the inverted "U-rack". Changing the specification of the bike racks to inverted "U-rack" design would result in a substantial change to the scope of work which would require the project to be competitively re-bid under the Public Contract Code. Rebidding the project would likely add another 8 to 12 weeks to the project schedule, and therefore may jeopardize the available grant funding for this project. The current project schedule as proposed is an aggressive schedule that doesn't have any flexibility for unforeseen conditions or delays (such as holidays' or manufacturing delays):



Therefore, in order for the City to maintain the grant funding, staff is recommending to proceed with the contract award to E C Construction Company for the citywide bike parking project. Minor field adjustments can be made to the bike parking locations after the award of the contract.

Discussion/Analysis

On November 6, 2019, the City Council considered a contract award for citywide bike parking at various locations (see Attachment 1). Based on the public comments from Active SGV, South Pasadena residents and the cycling community, the City Council directed staff to evaluate the possibility of replacing the proposed City custom design bike hitches with the inverted "U-rack" type bike parking, research off the "U-rack" shelf alternatives, and provide photos of the proposed bike parking locations (Attachment 2). A photo of each bike parking is shown below:



Staff contacted four vendors to get updated information on the inverted "U-racks". Vendors indicated that the basic inverted "U-racks", no custom features included, are not available off the shelf, and will need to be manufactured upon placement of an order. As of now, all four vendors that were contacted had a minimum six to eight week lead time for the equipment. Additional delays are anticipated due to the holidays' season.

The original bids received from the contractor included an installed price for the rack (including delivery, contractor oversight, and installation). The suggested inverted "U-rack" design has different installation requirements, therefore the plans would need to be revised to include the "U-rack" installation detail. The installation costs are anticipated to be higher than the original proposed bike hitch. Changing the specification of the bike racks, installation detail and locations would result in a substantial enough substantial change to the scope of work which would require the project to be competitively re-bid under the Public Contract Code Rebidding the project would likely add another 8 to 12 weeks to the project schedule, and may jeopardize

the available grant funding for this project. Furthermore, the City only received one responsive bid in the last round and there is no guarantee that the City will receive bids moving forward.

Original proposed bike parking locations were selected based on community feedback as part of the Bike Master Plan, input provided by Active SGV as part of the Bike Friendly Business District Program, and input received from the City Departments. Some of the locations originally requested did not allow for the required ADA access on the sidewalks, therefore adjustments had to be made to relocate the bike racks to maintain ADA access along the sidewalks. Attachment 2 outlines bike parking locations. If the City Council chooses to award the contract in its original form, then minor field adjustments can be made to these locations after the award of the contract. Significant changes in the bike parking locations may require rebidding and result in delay in the project and potentially jeopardize the project grand funding.

Fiscal Impact

In 2012 the City submitted a grant application for the South Pasadena Bicycle Parking project under the Caltrans Bicycle Transportation Account (BTA) fund, which was subsequently awarded. Staff turnover and competing priorities have delayed the implementation of this project. Since the grant was awarded, the BTA has granted several extensions for this funding. In March 2018, Staff received a letter from the BTA coordinator providing all agencies with outstanding funds a uniform final deadline of April 1, 2020 to submit the final invoice for their projects. For the City to meet this invoice deadline, the project would need to be completed by mid-March 2020. Staff reached out to the granting agency for a possible extension. The agency responded that another extension would be highly unlikely.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Council:

- 1. Accept a bid dated October 15, 2019 from E C Construction Company to install bike parking citywide at various locations (Project); and
- 2. Authorize the City Manager to enter into a contract with E C Construction Company for an amount not-to-exceed \$204,780 for the Project; and
- 3. Authorize a construction contingency of approximately ten percent in the amount of \$20,470 for a total amount of \$225,250.

Community Outreach

In 2012, the City was awarded a grant for bicycle parking, lockers, shelters and hitches. The bicycle parking is a part of the 2011 Bike Master Plan and the Project locations were selected after soliciting input from the community. The bike parking contract award was considered at the June 19, 2019 City Council Meeting. At that meeting, the City Council directed Staff to perform additional outreach regarding the bike lockers. Staff met with the Chamber of Commerce and Active San Gabriel Valley (SGV) to discuss the proposed bike lockers. Both groups expressed concerns with the bike lockers proposed in the original scope of work. Some of the major concerns expressed were the theft of the bike lockers and lockers being used to store other items besides bicycles.

Discussion/Analysis

Early in 2019 the project went out to bid and the following three firm's submitted bids:

The bid specifications were revised to remove the lockers. Removing the lockers substantially changed the project scope of work, requiring updates to the bid documents. Therefore, the Project was re-advertised for bid on September 27, 2019 and below is a summary of the updated bid received on October 15, 2019:

The City needs a manufacturer who can provide custom bike rack designs (hitches) to match the existing City designs. The manufacturer selected has experience, as they have provided some of the existing hitches throughout the City before. Due to the specialized nature of this project and the majority of the cost being in the manufacturing of the bicycle storage facilities, staff believes that it is highly unlikely that formally re-advertising the project would yield better results.

EC Construction Company is the successful lowest responsible bidder with a base bid of \$204,780. Staff has checked the company's references and their work has been verified to be of good quality. Therefore, Staff recommends award of the Project to EC Construction Company. The Project is expected to be completed in 120 working days.

Next Steps

Upon execution of the contract, the contractor will order the bike shelters and custom bike hitches which have a long lead time. Installation will begin immediately upon delivery of the bike storage facilities.

Background

The Project in general consists of providing parking for bicycles at various locations. The grant application identified three types of bike parking: bike hitches, bike shelters and bike lockers, as illustrated in the images on the subsequent page. The Project includes the installation of bicycle parking at Heritage Plaza, Arroyo Seco Trail, Arroyo Park, Library Park, Garfield Park, and throughout the City in the Business District. A total of 196 bicycle parking spaces will be installed. The Project will benefit the Community by providing adequate bicycle parking that will encourage bicycling in the City.

Based on the input received from the Chamber of Commerce and Active SGV, and lack of municipal code section to ensure proper use of bike lockers, bike lockers are removed from the project scope. The bike lockers will be replaced with bike shelters and additional bike hitches to meet the 196 bike parking spaces scoped in the grant application. Bike lockers can be considered in the future as a regional approach in coordination with Metro to determine effective locations and appropriate rental terms.

Construction Agreement with E C Construction Company

CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT / AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 6th day of November, 2019, by and between the CITY OF SOUTH PASADENA, a municipal corporation of the State of California, hereinafter referred to as "CITY" and E C CONSTRUCTION COMPANY, "CONTRACTOR."

That the CITY and the CONTRACTOR, for the consideration hereinafter named, mutually agree as follows:

- 1. Contract Documents. The complete contract and agreement ("AGREEMENT") consists of the Contract Documents, which includes all of the following documents incorporated herein by this reference: Approved Plans and Specifications (Project No. 2019-04), Notice Inviting Bids, Instructions to Bidders, Information for Bidders, Contractor's Bid Proposal, this Contract/Agreement, Standard Specifications, Special Provisions, Reference Specifications, the documents in the Appendix, if any, and all mutually agreed-upon modifications and amendments thereto. In the event of conflict between these documents, precedence shall be determined under section 2-5.2 of the Standard Specifications.
- **2.** Scope of Services. CONTRACTOR shall perform everything required to be performed, shall provide and furnish all the labor, materials, necessary tools, expendable equipment, and all utility and transportation services required for the following work of improvement: **Bike Shelters and Hitches at Various Locations** (**Project No. 2019-04**) all in accordance with the Contract Documents, Contractor's Proposal dated October 15, 2019 and Exhibit A.

CONTRACTOR agrees to perform all the work and furnish all the materials at his own cost and expense necessary to construct and complete in a good and workman-like manner and to the satisfaction of the City Engineer of the CITY, the Work of Improvement in accordance with the plans, specifications, and Contract Documents (the "Specifications") therefore prepared by City's Engineering Department and adopted by the City Council.

3. Compensation. CITY agrees to pay and CONTRACTOR agrees to accept in full payment for this Work of Improvement the stipulated sum of <u>Two Hundred Four Thousand</u> Seven Hundred and Eighty Dollars (\$204,780).

CITY agrees to make monthly payments and final payment in accordance with the method set forth in the Specifications.

- **4. Time for Completion.** CONTRACTOR agrees to commence construction of the Work of Improvement within fifteen (15) days after issuance of a Notice to Proceed, and to continue in a diligent and workman-like manner without interruption, and to complete the construction thereof within One Hundred Twenty (120) working days from the date the Notice to Proceed is issued.
- **5. Time is of the Essence.** Time is of essence of this Contract, and it is agreed that it would be impracticable or extremely difficult to ascertain the extent of actual loss or damage

which the CITY will sustain by reason of any delay in the performance of this Agreement. It is, therefore, agreed that CONTRACTOR will pay as liquidated damages to the CITY the following sum: Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each day's delay beyond the time herein prescribed for finishing work. If liquidated damages are not paid, as designated by the CITY, the CITY may deduct the amount thereof from any money due or that may become due the CONTRACTOR under this Agreement in addition to any other remedy available to CITY. The CONTRACTOR shall not be assessed liquidated damages for any delay caused by the failure of a public utility to relocate or remove an existing utility required for the performance of this Contract.

- **6. Prevailing Wages Required.** The CONTRACTOR will pay, and will require all subcontractors to pay, all employees on the work of improvement a salary or wage at least equal to the prevailing salary or wage established for such work as set forth in the wage determinations for this work. Travel and subsistence pay shall be paid in accordance with Labor Code Section 1773.8. The CONTRACTOR shall forfeit to the CITY, as penalty, \$200.00 for each calendar day or portion thereof for each worker paid (either by him or any subcontractors under him) less than the prevailing rate described above on the work provided for in this Agreement, all in accordance with Section 1775 of the Labor Code of the State of California.
- 7. 8-Hour Day. In the performance of this Contract, not more than eight (8) hours shall constitute a day's work, and the CONTRACTOR shall not require more than eight (8) hours in a day from any person employed by him hereunder, except as provided in the Labor Code of the State of California. The CONTRACTOR shall adhere to Article 3, Chapter 1, Part 7 (Sections 1810, et seq.) of the Labor Code of the State of California, and it is agreed that the CONTRACTOR shall forfeit to the CITY as a penalty the sum of \$200.00 for each worker employed in the execution of this Contract by the CONTRACTOR or any subcontractor for each calendar day during which any worker is required or permitted to labor more than eight (8) hours in violation of that article.
- **8. Workers Compensation.** CONTRACTOR, by executing this Agreement hereby certifies:

"I am aware of the provisions of Section 3700 of the Labor Code which requires every employer to be insured against liability for Worker's Compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of that Code, and I will comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the work of this Contract."

- 9. Bonds. CONTRACTOR shall, prior to the execution of this Contract, furnish two bonds approved by the CITY, one in the amount of One Hundred Percent (100%) of the Contract price, to guarantee the faithful performance of the work, and one in the amount of One Hundred Percent (100%) of the Contract price to guarantee payment of all claims for labor and materials furnished. This Contract shall not become effective until such bonds are supplied to and approved by the CITY. CONTRACTOR shall, prior to the release of the performance and payment bonds or the retention payment, furnish a warranty performance and payment bond equal to at least ten percent of the final contract price or \$1,000, whichever is greater.
- 10. Arbitration. This AGREEMENT is further subject to the provisions of Article 1.5 (commencing at Section 20104) of Division 2, Part 3 of the Public Contract Code regarding the resolution of public works claims of less than \$375,000. Article 1.5 mandates certain procedures for the filing of claims and supporting documentation by Contractor, for the response to such

claims by the Agency, for a mandatory meet and confer conference upon the request of Contractor, for mandatory nonbinding mediation in the event litigation is commenced, and for mandatory judicial arbitration upon the parties' failure to resolve the dispute through mediation. This AGREEMENT hereby incorporates the provisions of Article 1.5 as though fully set forth herein.

- 11. Prompt Payment. This Agreement is subject to the provisions of Article 1.7 (commencing at Section 20104.50) of Division 2, Part 3 of the Public Contract Code regarding prompt payment of contractors by local governments. Article 1.7 mandates certain procedures for the payment of undisputed and properly submitted payment requests within 30 days after receipt, for the review of payment requests, for notice to Contractor of improper payment requests, and provides for the payment of interest on progress payment requests which are not timely made in accordance with that Article. This AGREEMENT hereby incorporates the provisions of Article 1.7 as though fully set forth herein.
- 12. Securities for Retentions. At the request and expense of CONTRACTOR, securities equivalent to the amount withheld shall be deposited with AGENCY, or with a state or federally chartered bank in this state as the escrow agent, who shall then pay those moneys to CONTRACTOR upon Agency's confirmation of CONTRACTOR'S satisfactory completion of this AGREEMENT. At any time during the term of this AGREEMENT CONTRACTOR may, at its own expense, substitute securities for funds otherwise withheld as retention (or the retained percentage) in accordance with Public Contract Code § 22300.
- 13. Registration with DIR. Pursuant to Labor Code § 1725.5, CONTRACTOR and any subcontractor must be registered with the California Department of Industrial Relations for any bid proposal and prior to performing any work. Further, this project is subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement by the Department of Industrial Relations.
- **14. Subcontractor Eligibility.** This AGREEMENT is subject to Public Contract Code Section 6109: CONTRACTOR shall be prohibited from performing work on this project with a subcontractor who is ineligible to perform work on the project pursuant to Sections 1777.1 or 1777.7 of the Labor Code.
- 15. Apprentices. CONTRACTOR shall comply with the provisions of Labor Code Section 1777.5 concerning the employment of apprentices on public works projects, and further agrees that CONTRACTOR is responsible for compliance with Section 1777.5 by all of its subcontractors.
- 16. Records. CONTRACTOR shall maintain any and all ledgers, books of account, invoices, vouchers, canceled checks, and other records or documents evidencing or relating to charges for services or expenditures and disbursements charged to CITY under this Agreement for a minimum of three (3) years, or for any longer period required by law, from the date of final payment to CONTRACTOR under this Agreement. All such documents shall be made available for inspection, audit, and/or copying at any time during regular business hours, upon oral or written request of CITY. In addition, pursuant to Government Code Section 8546.7, all such documents and this Agreement shall be subject to the examination and audit of the State Auditor, at the request of CITY or as part of any audit of CITY, for a period of three (3) years after final payment under the Agreement.

17. Indemnity. To the fullest extent permitted by law, CONTRACTOR shall, at its sole cost and expense, fully defend, indemnify and hold harmless CITY, its authorized representatives and their respective subsidiaries, affiliates, members, directors, officers, employees and agents (collectively, the "Indemnitees") from and against any and all claims, actions, demands, costs, judgments, liens, penalties, liabilities, damages, losses, and expenses, including but not limited to any fees of accountants, attorneys or other professionals (collectively "Liabilities"), arising out of, in connection with, resulting from or related to, any alleged act, omission, fault or negligence of CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR's Representative, or any of its officers, agents, employees, Subcontractors or Suppliers, or any person or organization directly or indirectly employed by any of them (Collectively, the "Indemnitors"), in connection with or relating to or claimed to be in connection with or relating to the work performed under this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR shall not be entitled to any refund of attorneys' fees, defense costs and expenses in the event that it is s adjudicated to have been non-negligent.

CONTRACTOR shall not be required to defend or indemnify CITY for liabilities caused by the sole active negligence or willful misconduct of CITY.

If CONTRACTOR is a joint venture or partnership, each venturer or partner shall be jointly and severally liable for any and all of the duties and obligations of CONTRACTOR that are assumed under or arise out of this AGREEMENT. Each of such venturers or partners waives notice of the breach or non-performance of any undertaking or obligation of CONTRACTOR contained in, resulting from or assumed under this AGREEMENT, and the failure to give any such notice shall not affect or impair such venturer's or partner's joint and several liability hereunder.

18. Attorneys' Fees Following Disputes. In the event of a dispute between the parties under this AGREEMENT, the prevailing party is not entitled to attorneys' fees from the other party. This provision takes precedence over any conflicting provision in any of the documents which are incorporated herein by reference.



Map of Proposed Bike Parking Locations


