3. Yes, please read the following comment during the meeting for council response.

South Pasadenan reported 4/25/20 South Pasadena Care Center Covid19 cases 22 staff, 42 clients and 3 dead.

I live at [REDACTED] (50 feet from SPCC). No notification was provided of the extremely contagious outbreak. The alley between the buildings is shared by both commercial/residential tenants of my building and the staff of SPCC increasing likelihood of exposure. Withholding the information put me and my family at extreme risk. I had planned to visit my father for a social distance visit. He is awaiting open heart surgery which was delayed due to the virus. I could have unknowingly exposed my father which could have potentially killed him.

There are 3 restaurants in this building. If the virus is your top priority, a robust notification process is needed so people can make their own informed decision regarding their health and what risk they are willing to take regarding exposure.
