The November 1 Council meeting included discussion of street repairs as part of Agenda Item 11. There was emphasis on making the Monterey Hills/Altos area a priority, particularly Indiana Ave. I was not able to express my own thoughts about the street repairs nor speak on behalf of areas below the Monterey Hills/Altos areas. I do so now, by this writing.

Those who were able to raise their voices to advocate for that area touched on some points that I also wanted to emphasize regarding the lower portion of the Altos, especially down Brunswick and Kolle Avenues as well as streets such as Warwick and Lomitas.

There is no lighting on either of those streets nor any of the other streets in the lower Altos area which are mentioned below. A great deal of these streets have chuncks of crumbling asphalt in the gutters, along driveways, as well as along the streets. Kolle has no paved sidewalks at all whereas Brunswick at least has one sidewalk along the south side of the street. The same is true of the streets as one travels to the higher elevations near the water tower and surrounding areas. Both Kolle and Brunswick are extremely narrow, accommodating only two lanes of traffic and minimal parking at best, some restricted to only the driveway - if there is one.

Mr. Gerber's map showed the Orange portions that are scheduled for repairs in 2024 but it was difficult to make out which street is marked in Orange, Kolle or Brunswick, or neither. It would be good if both are scheduled for repair in 2024.

It's very true, the Altos, especially streets such as Indiana, are in dire need of repair. The streets are even more narrow than Kolle and Brunswick; there are no sidewalks whatsoever. The same is true of St. Albans, Oak Hill, Lomitas, Pine Crest, and Warwick, as examples. So what I wanted to point out at the November 1 meeting is that the needs of areas tangential to the Altos are also in drastic need of repair and attention.

It is my hope that they can be prioritized.







Cancelled Project (Arroyo Park)




