PUBLIC MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

FROM YOUR CITY COUNCIL

- On May 3, 2023, the City Council held a Special Joint Meeting
 with the Library Board of Trustees to receive and file the Library
 Strategic Plan for 2023-2027 and provided direction on facility
 improvements. Council has approved and funded the first phase of
 the new Library Site Plan.
- On June 7, 2023, the City Council approved an Award of Contract with Richards Watson & Gershon for City Attorney Services.
- On June 21, 2023, the City Council approved the adoption of the Fiscal Year 2023-24 Budget.
- On June 28, 2023, the City Council held a Special Meeting to adopt an urgency ordinance to establish an interim moratorium on nofault just cause evictions in the City.
- On July 19, 2023, the City Council approved a contract to begin redesigning the City's website and received the City's 2023 Economic Development Strategy.
- On August 29, 2023, the City Council held a Special Study Session Meeting related to the proposed General Plan Update, Downtown Specific Plan and Program Environmental Impact Report to discuss zoning text and map amendments for rezoning of properties.

FROM YOUR COMMISSIONS

- On May 31, 2023, Public Works Director Gerber provided a Slow Streets update to the Mobility and Transportation Infrastructure Commission including residential improvement plans.
- On June 28, 2023, all Commissions joined together to celebrate the 2023 Commissioner Congress in which they gave updates and presented their 2024 work plans.
- On July 25, 2023, the Natural Resources and Environmental Commission established a Plastics Task Force to focus on developing a plastic-free/zerowaste initiatives in the City.
- On August 8, 2023, the Planning Commission held a Public Hearing regarding the proposed General Plan Update, Downtown Specific Plan, and Program Environmental Impact Report.
- On August 24, 2023, the City had municipal financial consultant, Bill Statler for an input session on the City's five-year financial projection and analysis.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT HIGHLIGHTS

GENERAL PLAN/DOWNTOWN SPECIFIC PLAN UPDATE

During the summer months, City staff and the Planning Commission were busy finalizing several critical planning documents including the General Plan Update, Downtown Specific Plan, Zoning Text Amendments, and the related Program Environmental Impact Report. Two community meetings were led by consultant Kaiser Rangwala in June 2023 and the Planning Commission held three public meetings in August. The Planning Commission passed various resolutions recommending approval to the City Council. On August 29, a Special Study Session was held by the City Council to review the Planning Commission's recommendations and a Public Hearing is scheduled for September 18 at 6:30pm in the Council Chambers. The South Pasadena community is encouraged to attend or participate via Zoom to learn more and provide public comment on these important documents that will help shape the future of the City. SOUTH PASADENA FILM UPDATE

The Writer's Guild of America and Screen Actor's Guild continue to strike, further slowing down film production locally and beyond. Los Angeles Magazine reported on June 23, 2023, "It is official: every single major film and TV production within the Los Angeles city limits has now been shut down by the writers' strike." Locally, in South Pasadena we have seen a limited number of projects continue to shoot, most of which are smaller, nonunion, independent movies, commercials and personal projects.

Fun Fact: Before the strikes began, South Pasadena hosted many high profile projects including the recent feature film Oppenheimer, as well as television shows Fatal Attraction, Grey's Anatomy, Snowfall, And Just Like That. In addition, commercials featuring high profile Football players Joe Burrow, Josh Allen, and Justin Jefferson filmed recently in South Pasadena.

EVICITION MORATORIUM UPDATE

On May 17, 2023, the City Council adopted an Urgency Ordinance establishing a 45-day moratorium on no-fault just cause evictions. This Urgency Ordinance took effect immediately upon adoption. To give staff time to conduct sufficient research and community engagement while ensuring that renters remain protected, the City Council adopted another Urgency Ordinance extending the moratorium for an additional 6 months, which is set to expire on December 28, 2023. During this 6-month period, no eviction of any tenant in South Pasadena for "no-fault just cause" as defined in South Pasadena's Just Cause for Eviction Ordinance shall take place. Over the last few months, City staff have been working to develop an ordinance amending the City's Just Cause for Eviction Ordinance to address the issue of substantial remodel evictions. Efforts include a survey for South Pasadena renters, which is live until September 17, and available in English, Spanish and Chinese. STREETS! STREETS! STREETS!

The City is embarking on various street improvement efforts. On July 25, 2023, City officials, Commissioners, staff, and residents gathered to break ground on a series of transformative street improvement projects. Some projects that the City has already initiated include reconstruction and resurfacing, updating traffic signals on Fair Oaks Avenue between Columbia Street and Huntington Drive, and the City's Slow Streets Program.

The goal of the Slow Streets Program is to enhance traffic safety by reminding motorists to slow down and be aware of people using the street. Selected residential streets will utilize signage and other temporary traffic calming measures, such as curb extensions, dedicated bicycle lanes, and high visibility crosswalks. NO GAS SOUTH PAS EFFORTS CONTINUE!

The South Pasadena ban on gas-powered leaf blowers is in full effect and enforcement efforts are underway. The City's Community Improvement Officer has issued over 100 warning letters and dozens of notices of violation. City staff continue to provide education and outreach on alternative equipment with inperson demonstrations. This time – we're coming to you! On Monday, September 18, keep an eye out for the American Green Zone Alliance rolling down your street with various models of electric equipment. We'll stop by to say hello to your gardener and show them the kinds of equipment that are available and compliant within South Pasadena. SPHS PILOT PROGRAM FOR DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP

The City of South Pasadena and South Pasadena High School are working collaboratively to improve the student drop-off and pick-up procedures. Recognizing the need for a secondary drop-off and pick-up area, City staff has added a 5-minute loading zone south of Bank Street on the west side of Fremont Avenue on August 25, 2023. 

CITY'S ECONOMIC PROFILE

Overview of Sales Tax Trends in California: As of June 2023, the uncertainty of whether the nation will enter a recession continues to loom. Over the past year, the most significant trend observed has been strong employment numbers despite certain industry outlooks requiring a smaller workforce. The low unemployment rate has been a key driving force behind the Fed Funds 500% rate increase dating back to the summer of 2022. Yet, inflation lingers. Recent sales tax performance echoed more cautious behaviors by consumers, along with commodity prices fluctuating in multiple directions. Given the melting pot of economic indicators, our current outlook at this juncture is a modest decline in sales tax returns through CY 2023, with small levels of growth beginning in early 2024.

City of South Pasadena Sales Tax Highlights: South Pasadena's receipts from January through March were 1.2% above the first sales period in 2022. Excluding reporting aberrations, actual sales were up 0.2%. Dining establishments continued to improve as patrons continued to venture out to restaurants and entertainment establishments. However, a portion of the tax increase is related to inflationary factors of higher labor and food costs on the menu pricing. Food and drugs sector was the only other business type to post positive quarterly results, which were up by 7.4% this quarter.
